The Sheltered Work Opportunities Project is a registered charity set up to address the great need for meaningful occupation, in a supportive and pressure-free environment, for adults with severe and enduring mental illness. SWOP aims to use the therapeutic nature of horticulture to restore mental well-being.

Research shows that, in any one year, over 25% of the population experience a mental health problem. Many people with a long-term mental illness want and need to fill their time usefully and productively, but feel unable to cope with the stresses and pressures of open employment. Sheltered work in a realistic but pressure-free environment is often a good way to promote recovery by boosting self-esteem and confidence, providing companionship and mutual support, helping to dispel boredom and loneliness, and restoring dignity.

SWOP's first project, Cherry Tree Nursery, has grown from 4 volunteers on 2 acres in 1990, to 170 volunteers on 4.5 acres today. The nursery produces over 100,000 finished shrubs, 100,000 liners, 125,000 cuttings and 1,000 specimen-sized shrubs annually.

The Nursery aims to provide a supportive family atmosphere and to address the individual needs of each volunteer. There is no time limit to anyone's stay, and the nursery offers continuing support to those volunteers who have chosen to move on.

Volunteers work in all aspects of the nursery. This can vary from taking cuttings, laying slabs and digging trenches, to operating the till, issuing invoices, delivering plants and making the tea. Cherry Tree offers a very wide range of support including literacy and numeracy classes, introduction to computers, horticultural classes, a specialist disability Rights Advice Service, Cooking on a Budget, and Healthy Eating. Volunteers are offered a wide range of social activities, outings, visits, holidays and events which can enable them to become more independent and broaden their outlook. They are encouraged to care for each other and to feel important, valued, needed, loved and respected, and to learn to laugh again.

SWOP was awarded 'The Queen's Golden Jubilee Award' in 2003 for voluntary service by groups in the community, and 'The Lilly Reintegration Award Recognising Outstanding Achievement in Mental Health' in 2004 for moving volunteers' lives forward. In June 2006 we were Highly Commended for the prestigious *Beacon Prize* for our 'philanthropic achievements' and in 2008, given the Rotary Club Community Service Award. In 2010 we were presented with the Wessex Charity of the Year Award.

Due to the high costs of running such a specialist concern, the nursery will always rely heavily on fund-raising for donations in order to continue helping restore dignity to an often neglected and excluded section of the community

**Abelia x grandiflora**

Beautiful medium-sized semi-evergreen shrub. It has small dark green glossy leaves and delightful clusters of small pinkish-white bell-shaped slightly fragrant flowers from July to October. Needs a sheltered position.

**Abelia x grandiflora 'Francis Mason' (v)**

Beautiful medium-sized semi-evergreen shrub. It has attractive small golden variegated leaves and bears a profusion of fragrant, bell-shaped, white flowers, tinged with pink, from mid-summer to mid-autumn. Needs a sunny sheltered site.

**Abies nordmanniana**

Large evergreen coniferous tree with glossy rich green needle-like leaves, silver underneath. It produces female cones on the upper branches in late spring and early summer and reddish-brown buds in winter. This is a wonderful ornamental tree. It is often also used as a Christmas tree, as when cut off at the base it will not drop its needles.

**Abutilon 'Kentish Belle' (v)**

Medium to large evergreen shrub with purple-brown shoots and dark green leaves, grown for its abundant highly attractive bell-shaped apricot-yellow flowers with red and purple centres, which are produced over a long period in summer. Ideal for a south-facing wall or conservatory.

**Abutilon megapotamicum**

Medium to large evergreen or semi-evergreen shrub with large bright green leaves, grown for its very showy bell-shaped flowers with yellow petals and purple stamens, which protrude from large red heart-shaped bases, and are borne along the young shoots from summer to autumn. Ideal for a sunny sheltered border.

**Abutilon x milleri 'Variegatum'**

Semi-evergreen medium open shrub. It has unusual green leaves mottled yellow. Long bell-shaped pink and apricot flowers are produced over a long period in summer. Half-hardy. Ideal for a south-facing wall or conservatory.

**Acacia baileyana 'Purpurea' (Cootamunda wattle)**

Small evergreen tree or large shrub grown for its delicate fern-like leaves deep purple when young which mature to an attractive blue-green and set off the round bright yellow flowerheads which are born from winter to spring. Prefers a sunny sheltered site. Ideal for a border, or as a specimen plant. Prune after flowering.

**Acacia dealbata (Mimosa)**

Fast-growing medium-sized evergreen tree. It has delicate green feathery leaves and fluffy golden fragrant flowers in early spring. Prefers a sheltered site.

**Acacia pravissima (Ovens Wattle)**

Large evergreen shrub or small tree with short hanging branches crowded with small triangular grey-green leaves. Profuse clusters of fragrant bright yellow round flowerheads are borne in late winter and spring. Ideal for a border or as a specimen plant in a sheltered site. Extremely popular for flower arranging.

**Acanthus mollis (Bear's Breeches)**

Medium-sized clump-forming perennial with spectacular very large shiny dark green leaves and striking very long spikes of purple and white flowers in summer, often with purple-tinted stems. This is a stunning architectural plant, ideal for a spacious border. Also good for cut or dried flowers.

**Acer (seedling) (Japanese maple)**

Graceful deciduous shrub or small tree with stunningly beautiful autumn leaf colour. Good for brightening small gardens.

**Acer palmatum f. atropurpureum (Purple Japanese maple)**

Deciduous shrub or small tree with stunning reddish-purple foliage which turns brilliant red in autumn. A good tree for brightening small gardens especially in the autumn.

**Acorus gramineus 'Ogon' (v) (Variegated Japanese Rush)**

Evergreen dwarf perennial grass grown for its fans of delicate bright golden-green foliage. Can tolerate waterlogged ground. Ideal pondside plant.

**Actaea simplex 'Pink Spike' (Baneberry)**

Small perennial grown for its decorative black foliage (green when young) and spikes of small scented white flowers, borne from July to September, followed by clusters of attractive but highly toxic berries. Ideal for a woodland garden or shady mixed or herbaceous border. Harmful if eaten/skin allergen.

**Actinidia kolomikta**

Striking medium-sized deciduous twining climber grown for its unusual and colourful large creamy-white pink and green leaves. It bears small white scented flowers in June, followed by sweet yellowish fruits. Ideal for covering walls or tree stumps in sun or partial shade.

**Actinida pilosula**

Medium to large deciduous twining climber, grown for its dark green oval leaves with pink and white tips when young. Ideal for training against a wall or into a tree in a sheltered sunny spot.

**Agapanthus 'Big Blue' (African Blue Lily)**

Medium-sized evergreen perennial with long strap-shaped green leaves grown for its tall stalks bearing stunning large round heads of rich blue flowers in mid or late summer. Prefers a moist sunny site.

**Agapanthus 'Blue Baby'**

Small to medium perennial with long narrow green leaves and stunning clusters of mid-blue flowers in late summer. Ideal for the front of a sunny border.

**Agapanthus 'Blue Giant'**

Spectacular large perennial with glossy green strap-like leaves, grown for its large round heads of intense blue flowers from mid to late summer. Ideal for a sunny perennial border. Mulch in cold winters or over winter in a dry place.

**Agapanthus 'Deep Purple'**

Medium-sized clump-forming evergreen perennial with long narrow green strap-shaped leaves, grown for its tall stalks bearing stunning round purple flowerheads in mid or late summer. Prefers a moist sunny site.

**Agapanthus 'Purple Star'**

Small to medium clump-forming semi-evergreen perennial with long narrow strap-like dark green leaves, grown for its tall stunning round heads of tubular deep purple flowers in summer. Prefers a sunny well-drained site. Ideal for a container, bed or border.

**Agapanthus 'Snowball'**

Small to medium evergreen perennial with long glossy green strap-like leaves, grown for its tall stalks bearing stunning large round heads of pure white flowers borne in mid and late summer. Ideal for a sunny border.

**Agapanthus 'Tinkerbell' (v) (1.5 litre)**

Small clump forming evergreen perennial with strap-shaped green leaves with cream-white edges grown for its clusters of bell-shaped mid-blue flowers in summer. Ideal for the front of a sunny border, where it can look stunning.

**Agapanthus africanus**

Small perennial with narrow green grass-like leaves and stunning clusters of deep blue flowers in late summer.

**Agapanthus africanus white**

Medium-sized clump-forming evergreen perennial with green strap-like leaves, grown for its large round heads of trumpet-shaped pure white flowers born in mid and late summer, followed by decorative seed heads. Prefers a sunny site. Ideal for a border or larger container.

**Agapanthus praecox 'Queen Anne'**

Medium-sized compact evergreen perennial, grown for its very attractive clusters of brilliant blue flowers borne on long stems above its strap-like leaves in summer. Ideal for a sunny border or container. Mulch in winter.

**Agave americana 'Marginata' (v) (3 litre)**

Medium to large succulent grown for its lance-shaped, spine-tipped and spiny-margined grey-green leaves with pale yellow margins which often become white with age. Sometimes bears heads of flowers on tall central spikes followed by heads of black seeds. Ideal specimen plant for a well-drained sheltered sunny site.

**Akebia quinata (Chocolate Vine)**

Vigorous twining semi-evergreen climber with unusual green lobed leaves. It bears vanilla-scented chocolate coloured flowers in early spring followed by sausage-shaped purplish fruits. Best grown against a wall or in a sheltered site

**Alchemilla mollis (Lady's Mantle)**

Small clump-forming perennial bearing small greenish-yellow flowers from early to late summer above bluish-green foliage. A popular cottage garden favourite which provides excellent ground cover. Any well-drained soil in sun or light shade.

**Allium cristophii**

Small bulbous perennial, one of the larger flowering varieties of allium, grown for its star-shaped, purple-pink flowers which are produced in early summer. The flowerheads are excellent for drying. Prefers well-drained soil in full sun.

**Allium hollandicum 'Purple Sensation' (1.5 litre)**

Small to medium bulbous perennial, grown for its masses of striking, star-shaped deep violet flowers produced throughout summer. The flowerheads are excellent for drying. Prefers well-drained soil in full sun.

**Ampelopsis brevipedunculata var. maximowiczii 'Elegans'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber grown for its attractively coloured foliage and berries. The leaves are dark green, heavily mottled with white and pink, and may turn red and yellow in autumn. Small green flowers in summer are followed by attractive spherical pinkish-purple fruits, which turn a wonderful dark turquoise-blue.

**Anemone hupehensis var japonica 'Prinz Heinrich' (Windflower)**

Lovely small perennial Japanese anemone, with abundant dark pink flowerheads nodding above the foliage in late summer and early autumn. Useful for brightening the garden late in the season. Can tolerate dry shady conditions. Contact with sap may irritate skin.

**Anemone x hybrida 'Honorine Jobert' (Windflower)**

Lovely small perennial Japanese anemone, with abundant single white flowerheads nodding above the foliage in late summer and early autumn. Useful for brightening the garden late in the season. Can tolerate dry shady conditions. Contact with sap may irritate skin.

**Anemone x hybrida 'Queen Charlotte' (syn. 'Konigin Charlott')**

A lovely small deciduous perennial Japanese anemone grown for its abundant large semi-double pink flowers with purple shading underneath, borne from late summer to mid autumn. Ideal for a border. Contact with sap may irritate skin.

**Anemone x hybrida 'September Charm' (Windflower)**

A pretty small to-medium deciduous perennial Japanese anemone, grown for its large single rose-pink flowerheads which nod attractively above the foliage from August to October. A useful plant for brightening the garden late in the season. Can tolerate dry shady conditions. Contact with sap may irritate skin.

**Anemone x hybrida 'Serenade' (Windflower)**

Lovely small perennial Japanese anemone, with abundant semi-double pink flowerheads nodding above the foliage in late summer and early autumn. Useful for brightening the garden late in the season. Can tolerate dry shady conditions. Contact with sap may irritate skin.

**Anemone x hybrida 'Whirlwind' (Windflower)**

Lovely small perennial Japanese anemone, with abundant double white flowerheads nodding above the foliage in late summer and early autumn. Useful for brightening the garden late in the season. Can tolerate dry shady conditions.

**Anisodonteia 'Large Magenta'**

Small to medium colourful evergreen shrub, grown for its profusion of large magenta flowers produced from June to September. Needs a sunny sheltered site. Ideal for a container patio plant.

**Anisodonteia scabrosa**

A colourful medium-sized evergreen shrub. It produces masses of small rose-magenta flowers over a long period throughout the summer. Prefers full sun in a sheltered site. Ideal container plant. Protect from hard frosts.

**Aquilegia 'Heavenly Blue' (Columbine)**

Medium-sized cottage garden perennial with attractively divided fern-like leaves grown for its graceful and pretty sky-blue flowers which are borne in profusion in late spring and early summer. Ideal for a pot or sunny border, but also thrives in partial shade. Deadhead to prolong flowering.

**Aquilegia 'Red Hobbit'**

Dwarf form of this old-fashioned cottage garden perennial with attractive ferny leaves, grown for its graceful and pretty red flowers in late spring and early summer. Deadhead to prolong flowering. Ideal for a pot or sunny border. Contact with sap may irritate skin.

**Aquilegia Swan Series Burgundy and White**

Medium-sized cottage garden perennial with attractive ferny leaves, grown for its strikingly contrasting burgundy and white flowers in late spring and early summer. Ideal for a sunny border. Deadhead to prolong flowering. Contact with sap may irritate skin.

**Aquilegia Swan Series Pink and Yellow**

Medium-sized cottage garden perennial with attractive ferny leaves, grown for its strikingly contrasting pink and yellow flowers in late spring and early summer. Ideal for a sunny border. Deadhead to prolong flowering. Contact with sap may irritate skin.

**Aquilegia Swan Series Violet and White**

Medium-sized cottage garden perennial with attractive ferny leaves, grown for its strikingly contrasting violet and white flowers in late spring and early summer. Ideal for a sunny border. Deadhead to prolong flowering. Contact with sap may irritate skin.

**Arbutus unedo (Strawberry Tree)**

Large spreading shrubby tree with flaky red-brown bark and oval shallowly-toothed glossy mid-green leaves. Small white flowers in pendent panicles open through autumn, while spherical red fruits ripen the following autumn

**Artemisia 'Powis Castle' (Sagebrush)**

Small evergreen spreading shrub, grown for its striking silvery feather-like highly aromatic foliage. Needs a sunny well-drained site. Trim after last frosts to keep tidy. Good seaside plant.

**Arum italicum subsp italicum 'Marmoratum'**

Small tuberous perennial grown for its attractive deep green arrow-shaped leaves with pale green veins, often used in flower arrangements. For larger leaves grow in a partially shaded site. All parts may cause severe discomfort if ingested and sap may irritate skin on contact.

**Asplenium scolopendrium 'Angustatum'**

Popular small to medium evergreen fern with narrow strap-like bright green fronds with cut edges. An attractive fern for a garden or pot, easy to grow in most soils and locations, but will thrive in a moist site in dappled shade.

**Asplenium scolopendrium Cristatum Group (Crested Harts Tongue Fern)**

Attractive small evergreen fern grown for its leathery bright green fronds with unusual crested ends. Easy to grow in any soil or aspect, as long as it does not dry out completely. Often grown on walls, this is a native British fern.

**Astelia chathamica 'Silver Spear'**

Medium-sized clump-forming perennial, grown for its startling silver sword-shaped leaves. Long-stalked pale yellowish-green flowers are borne in mid to late spring. Prefers moist soil in sun or partial shade.

**Aster x frikartii 'Monch'**

Medium-sized upright clump-forming perennial with dark green leaves, grown for its long-lasting lavender blue daisy-like flowers with orange-yellow centres, borne on long stems from June to October. Ideal for a mixed or herbaceous border in a sunny site, but will thrive anywhere. Unlike many asters, it is not prone to mildew. Deadhead to prolong flowering.

**Aster dumosus Sapphire**

Small mound-forming deciduous perennial with narrow dark green leaves grown for its delightful clusters of lilac-blue flowers throughout summer and autumn. This variety is particularly recommended because it is resistant to both mildew and rabbits! Attractive to butterflies and bees.

**Astilbe 'Bressingham Beauty'**

This popular small medium perennial is grown for its unusual plumes of feathery bright pink flowerheads, which appear above the attractive bronze-flushed green leaves from June to August. Prefers moist rich soil in sun or shade. Cut back dead stalks in spring.

**Astilbe x arendsii 'Fanal'**

Popular small perennial which has attractive deeply cut leaves, coppery in spring turning green in summer. From June to August it produces eye-catching large feathery crimson-red plumes above the foliage. Prefers moist rich soil in partial shade. Cut back dead stalks in spring.

**Astilbe x arendsii 'Diamant'**

Medium-sized perennial with attractive deeply cut green leaves with red stems, grown for its striking plume-like heads of tiny white flowers in spring and summer. Ideal for a moist or boggy sunny site, or a dry shady site. Cut back dead stalks in spring.



**Astilbe chinensis var. pumila**

Attractive dwarf perennial grown for its striking plume-like heads of tiny reddish-pink flowers borne in late summer forming a dainty elegant effect. The flowers contrast with the reddish-green leaves. Ideal for a moist or boggy sunny site. If the soil is dry, plant in a shady site. Protect from late frosts.

**Athyrium niponicum var. pictum**

Lovely small deciduous fern, grown for its attractive unusual silvery-grey fronds with purplish centres, providing a lovely contrast in front of taller green plants in a herbaceous border, or shady pond margins or woodland areas. Remove old fronds in spring after last frosts to let new growth uncurl. Mulch in severe weather. Keep moist during hot dry conditions.

**Aucuba japonica 'Variegata' (f/v) (Spotted Laurel)**

Medium to large evergreen shrub grown for its all-year-round interest: its large glossy yellow-speckled green leaves form a dense rounded dome in the summer, and large oblong vibrant red berries are borne throughout the winter. Tolerant of deep shade. Can be trimmed to form a hedge. May cause mild stomach upset if ingested.

**Azalea**

We aim to grow a small selection of dwarf evergreen varieties. Please enquire about availability.

**Azara microphylla**

Small bushy evergreen shrub with attractive silky silvery leaves and pink-tinged buds, which open to white flowers with yellow centres in early summer. Needs sunny well-drained sheltered site. Silver foliage contrasts well in a mixed border.

**Berberis darwinii**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub with small very dark green glossy spiny foliage and spectacular deep yellow flowers in April to May, followed by blue-black round berries. Can also be grown as a neat trimmed hedge. Grow in any soil.

**Berberis darwinii 'Compacta'**

Small compact evergreen shrub with small dark green glossy spiny holly-like leaves. It is covered with deep yellow flowers in spring, followed by blue-black berries. This is a very compact form of the popular hedging plant, which looks good all year round in a border or as a low hedge.

**Berberis x ottawensis f. purpurea 'Superba'**

Medium to large deciduous shrub grown for its rich purple-red foliage. Small bright yellow flowers in late spring are followed by egg-shaped red fruits in autumn. Its boldly coloured foliage contrasts well in a mixed border. Grow in any soil.

**Berberis thunbergii f. atropurpurea 'Atropurpurea Nana' (Crimson Pygmy)**

Small compact deciduous thorny shrub with reddish-purple foliage and dainty pale yellow flowers in late spring, followed by red fruits. Ideal for rock gardens and dwarf hedges. Grows well in most situations.

**Berberis thunbergii f. atropurpurea 'Aurea'**

Medium-sized deciduous thorny shrub, grown for its small golden-yellow leaves, and small red-tinged pale yellow flowers in mid-spring followed by red berries in autumn. Ideal for a mixed border, in most soils. May cause mild stomach upset if ingested; contact with spines may irritate skin.

**Berberis thunbergii f. atropurpurea 'Golden Ring'**

Medium-sized deciduous thorny shrub grown for its reddish-purple leaves with an unusual golden ring round the edge. It bears yellow flowers in April and May followed by red fruits. Grows well in most situations.

**Berberis thunbergii f. atropurpurea 'Harlequin' (v)**

Medium deciduous shrub with small deep rose leaves, speckled white, turning crimson-pink in autumn. Yellow flowers, suffused red, appear in late summer.

**Berberis thunbergii f. atropurpurea 'Red Pillar'**

Medium-sized deciduous thorny shrub grown for its pillar-like shape and attractive red-purple foliage. Yellow flowers in April are followed by red berries. Grows well in most situations.

**Berberis thunbergii 'Golden Rocket'**

Medium-sized deciduous narrow upright shrub grown for its bright golden-yellow leaves with red tips to the new growth between April and September. The leaves turn a brilliant orange-red in autumn. Grows well in most situations, trim to shape in early spring. May cause mild stomach upset if ingested, contact with spines may irritate skin.

**Berberis verruculosa**

Slow-growing medium-sized evergreen shrub with glossy dark green spiky leaves. Grown for its clusters of bright yellow flowers in late spring and early summer, which are followed by blue-black fruits. Can also be grown as a neat trimmed hedge. Grow in any soil. May cause mild stomach upset if ingested, contact with spines may irritate skin.

**Bergenia 'Bressingham White' (Elephant's Ears)**

Low-growing evergreen perennial with large deep green leaves, grown for its outstanding pure white hyacinth-like flowers in spring. Benefits from a general feed in spring. Ideal for a woodland garden or border, making excellent ground cover.

**Bergenia 'Wintermarchen' (syn. 'Winter Fairytale') (Elephant's Ears)**

Low-growing compact delightful evergreen perennial grown for its deep green leaves which are bright red-purple underneath and are attractively red tinged in winter, and its heads of dark rose-red flowers borne from early to midspring. Ideal for a woodland garden or border. It makes excellent ground cover.

**Brachyglottis (Senecio) (Dunedin Group) 'Sunshine'**

Medium-sized evergreen bushy shrub bearing soft silvery-grey leaves with clusters of yellow daisy-like flowers from summer to autumn. Its silvery foliage contrasts well in a mixed border. Ideal for seaside areas. Drought tolerant.

**Brachyglottis Walberton's Silver Dormouse (syn. 'Walbrach')**

Attractive compact small to medium evergreen shrub grown for its stunning bright silver foliage and large clusters of rich golden yellow daisy-like flowers throughout summer and autumn. It will flourish in a sunny well-drained site. Ideal for a border or in large container.

**Buddleia 'Lochinch' (Butterfly Bush)**

Large semi-evergreen shrub with grey-green leaves. It is grown for its long plumes of fragrant lavender-coloured flowers which are highly attractive to bees and butterflies and appear from July to October. Can be pruned hard in spring.

**Buddleia 'Pink Delight' (Butterfly Bush)**

Large deciduous shrub grown for its long bright pink flowers, which are highly attractive to butterflies and bees and appear from July to October. Can be pruned hard in spring.

**Buddleia alternifolia**

Large deciduous shrub or small tree with long dark green leaves, grown for its dense rounded clusters of intensely fragrant lilac flowers which wreath the branches in early summer. An excellent specimen plant.

**Buddleia davidii 'Black Knight' (Butterfly Bush)**

Large deciduous shrub grown for its long highly fragrant very dark violet flowers, which are highly attractive to butterflies and bees and appear from July to October. Can be pruned hard in spring.

**Buddleia davidii 'Harlequin' (v)**

Large deciduous shrub grown for its plumes of long fragrant red-purple flowers which are highly attractive to butterflies and bees and appear from July to October, and for its long pointed dark green leaves with creamy-white margins. Can be pruned hard in spring.

**Buddleia davidii 'Peace' (Butterfly Bush)**

Large deciduous shrub grown for its large long fragrant white heads of flowers with an unusual orange eye. These are highly attractive to butterflies and bees and appear from July to October. Grows in most situations and can be pruned hard in spring.

**Buddleia davidii 'Royal Red' (Butterfly Bush)**

Large deciduous shrub grown for its long fragrant red-purple heads of flowers which are highly attractive to butterflies and bees and appear from July to October. Grows in most situations and can be pruned hard in spring.

**Buddleia globosa (Orangeball tree)**

Unusual large semi-evergreen shrub grown for its sweetly-scented orange ball-like flowers in May and June. Grows in most situations and can be pruned hard in spring.

**Buxus sempervirens 'Elegantissima' (v)**

Medium-sized slow-growing evergreen shrub grown for its dense narrow white-margined small dark green leaves. Ideal for hedging or topiary, can be clipped to shape. Contact with sap may irritate skin.

**Buxus sempervirens (Common Box)**

A slow-growing evergreen shrub with a dense mass of small dark green leaves. Ideal for hedging or topiary. Often used for knot gardens. Can be trimmed to size.

**Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Overdam' (v) (Feather reed grass)**

Medium-sized clump-forming perennial grass with long flat slightly glossy mid-green leaves with pale yellow margins and stripes which fade to pink. Bears long-lasting elegant purple flowerheads which become greyish-pink. Ideal as an architectural plant for a herbaceous or mixed border.

### **Calamagrostis brachytricha (Diamond Grass)**

Medium-sized perennial grass grown for its beautiful tall heads of pinkish-brown flowers borne in mid and late summer which last throughout the winter. Ideal as a long-lasting and elegant architectural feature in a border. Cut down in early spring.

### **Callicarpa bodinieri var. 'Profusion'**

Large deciduous shrub grown for its small pale pink flowers in summer, which are followed by masses of dark violet fruit in autumn, and contrast with the dark green leaves which are bronze when young.

### **Callistemon rigidus (Stiff Bottlebrush)**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub with graceful arching branches clad with narrow pointed green leaves. It produces exotic deep red bottlebrush-like flowers throughout the summer. Prefers a sheltered, well-drained sunny site.

### **Callistemon citrinus 'Splendens'**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub with long narrow pointed lemon-scented green leaves and dense spikes of deep red bottlebrush-like flowers throughout the summer. Needs sheltered site, best in well-drained sunny position.

### **Camellia japonica 'Lady Vansittart'**

A showy medium to large evergreen shrub with glossy dark green leaves and beautiful semi-double white flowers with unusual rose-pink stripes in late winter and early spring. Prefers acid or neutral soil. Early morning sunshine can damage flowers.

### **Camellia x williamsii 'Donation'**

A medium to large evergreen shrub with glossy dark green leaves and beautiful large semi-double orchid pink flowers in late winter and early spring. A reliable flowering variety. Prefers acid or neutral soil. Early morning sunshine can damage flowers.

### **Campanula lactiflora 'Loddon Anna' (Milky Bellflower)**

Medium-sized upright perennial grown for its profuse clusters of delightful bell-shaped soft lilac-pink flowers borne from early summer until autumn. May need staking in exposed sites. Ideal for a mixed or herbaceous border or for a wildflower or woodland garden. Cut back in spring.

### **Campanula punctata 'Hot Lips'**

Small clump-forming perennial grown for its delightful long soft pink bells spotted with purple-red borne throughout the summer. Cut back after flowering to encourage a second flush of flowers. Ideal for a border for that cottage garden effect. The delicate flower colours are preserved best in partial shade.

### **Campanula punctata 'Pink Chimes'**

Small compact deciduous perennial with spreading green foliage, grown for its profusion of pink bell-shaped flowers borne prolifically from May to August. Ideal for a container or for ground cover in sun or part shade. Trim off the old flowering stems to encourage more flowering.

**Campanula takesimana 'Elizabeth'**

Attractive small perennial grown for its unusual and striking pendant bell-shaped reddish-purple flowers, which are spotted red inside and are borne profusely from May to August. Cut back after flowering to encourage a second flush of flowers. Ideal for a border for that cottage garden effect. The delicate flower colours are preserved best in partial shade.

**Campsis grandiflora**

Vigorous deciduous climber with stunning large exotic trumpet-shaped brilliant orange flowers in late summer. Needs sunny south-facing wall.

**Campsis radicans (Trumpete creeper)**

Vigorous deciduous climber with stunning large exotic trumpet-shaped brilliant orange flowers in late summer. Needs sunny south-facing wall.

**Campsis radicans 'Flamenco' (Red Trumpet Vine)**

Large deciduous climber with dark green leaves, grown for its stunning exotic clusters of large tubular bright red flowers with orange centres, borne from late summer to autumn. Prefers a sunny south-facing wall, fence, roof or tree stump. May be pruned in late winter or early spring.

**Canna 'Durban' (3 litre)**

Striking medium-sized perennial, grown for its stunning, large tropical purple and maroon leaves with red and yellow stripes, and massive exotic and eye-catching shocking-orange flowers, borne from July to October. Leaves die down to ground level in winter. Rhizomes should be lifted in winter in harsh weather areas. Prefers a sheltered sunny site.

**Carex buchananii (New Zealand everbrown sedge)**

Small evergreen perennial grass with striking upright bronze foliage with curled tips like pigs' tails. A fine architectural plant. Can be used in flower arrangements.

**Carex comans 'Frosted Curls' (New Zealand hair Sedge)**

Evergreen perennial grass, grown for its cascading fountains of narrow hair-like whitish-green leaves with curling tips, forming a low cascading mound. Very effective as edging in a rock garden or container.

**Carex phyllocephala 'Sparkler' (v)**

Medium-sized evergreen perennial, grown for its stunningly variegated tapered spiky leaves with bold creamy-white margins. An excellent container plant. Prefers a shady site.

**Carex siderosticha 'Variegata'**

Small clump-forming perennial sedge, with thinly textured leaves which are flushed with pink when they first emerge in the spring, but which then turn pale green and are striped with an attractive gold colour that lasts the whole season. Prefers fertile moist soil in sun or partial shade.

**Carex testacea**

Small evergreen perennial grass with narrow arching pale olive-green leaves, which are an attractive orange-brown in full sun. It bears pale brown flower spikes in mid-summer.

**Carex testacea 'Prairie Fire'**

Evergreen perennial sedge, grown for its small, narrow arching pale olive-green leaves, which are an attractive orange-brown in full sun. It bears dark brown flower spikes in midsummer.

**Caryopteris x clandonensis 'Heavenly Blue'**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub with masses of lovely blue flowers in autumn, complemented by greyish-green aromatic leaves. Highly attractive to butterflies, moths and bees.

**Caryopteris x clandonensis 'Kew Blue'**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub with masses of lovely blue flowers in autumn, complemented by greyish-green aromatic leaves. Highly attractive to butterflies, moths and bees.

**Caryopteris incana 'Delft Blue'**

Medium-sized deciduous dense mound-forming shrub with attractive aromatic grey-green leaves, grown for its masses of lovely blue flowers in late summer and autumn. Ideal for a mixed or shrub border.

**Ceanothus 'Autumnal Blue' (Californian Lilac)**

A medium-sized fast-growing evergreen shrub with abundant deep blue flowers in late summer and autumn. Often grown as a wall shrub. One of the hardiest Ceanothus.

**Ceanothus 'Blue Mound'**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub forming a dense mound of glossy dark green leaves, grown for its profusion of heads of dark blue flowers in late spring. Prefers a fertile well-drained sunny sheltered site. Prune and mulch after flowering.

**Ceanothus 'Blue Sapphire'**

Low-growing evergreen shrub, which forms a mound of attractive very dark purplish-green foliage which is covered with dark sapphire-blue flowers in spring and early summer. Ideal for ground cover, for the front of borders, or for containers. Prefers a sunny site.

**Ceanothus 'Concha' (Californian Lilac)**

A medium to large evergreen shrub with small glossy green leaves and masses of lovely red buds, opening into deep blue flowers in early summer. Prefers a sunny site.

**Ceanothus 'Dark Star' (Californian Lilac)**

A medium-sized evergreen shrub with small deeply-veined dark green leaves grown for its dark purplish-blue honey-scented flowers in early summer. It is popular because it is one of the deepest blue Ceanothus. Often grown as a wall shrub. Prefers a sunny site.

**Ceanothus 'Italian Skies' (Californian Lilac)**

A medium to large evergreen shrub with small glossy green leaves grown for its masses of lovely red buds opening into bright mid-blue flowers in early summer. Prefers a sunny site. Ideal for a border or against a wall.

**Ceanothus 'Pershore Zanzibar' (v)**

An unusual medium-sized evergreen shrub grown for its stunning bright yellow leaves, splashed with green, and mid-blue flowers in spring. Ideal for a sunny shrub border.

**Ceanothus thyrsiflorus 'Skylark'**

Medium-sized bushy evergreen shrub with glossy mid-green leaves, grown for its masses of dark blue flowers borne in late spring and early summer. Ideal for a sunny shrub border or against a wall. Prune and mulch after flowering.

**Ceanothus 'Puget Blue'**

Medium-sized vigorous evergreen shrub covered with a profusion of deep blue flowers in late spring and early summer. Often grown as a wall shrub. Prefers a sunny site.

**Ceanothus thyrsiflorus var. repens (Creeping blue blossom)**

Low-growing evergreen shrub with a spreading habit, which forms a mound of dark green foliage entirely covered with mid blue flowers in spring. Prefers a sunny site.

**Cephalaria gigantea (Giant scabious)**

Large clump-forming perennial grown for its attractive primrose-yellow flowerheads in early and mid-summer. Ideal for the back of a herbaceous border or for a wildflower garden in sun or partial shade.

**Ceratostigma griffithii (Hardy Plumbago)**

Small semi-evergreen shrub with purple-edged mid-green leaves which turn red in autumn, grown for its bright clusters of vivid blue flowers in late summer. Prefers a sheltered site.

**Ceratostigma plumbaginoides**

Small spreading perennial with upright red stems and bright green leaves which are richly red-tinted in autumn. It is grown mainly for its stunning clusters of brilliant blue flowers in late summer. Ideal for a sunny sheltered border, or can be grown as ground cover or in a rock garden.

**Chaenomeles speciosa 'Snow' (Flowering Quince)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its dense clusters of beautiful long-lasting pure white flowers which appear in late winter before the leaves. Often grown as a wall shrub to brighten the winter garden.

**Chaenomeles x superba 'Cameo' (Flowering Quince)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its dense clusters of beautiful long-lasting double peach-pink flowers which appear in late winter before the leaves. Often grown as a wall shrub to brighten the winter garden.

**Chaenomeles x superba 'Crimson and Gold' (Flowering Quince)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its dense clusters of beautiful deep red flowers with conspicuous golden-yellow anthers. These are borne over a long period in late winter and appear before the leaves. They are followed by round yellow fruits. Often grown as a wall shrub to brighten the winter garden.

**Chaenomeles x superba 'Pink Lady' (Flowering Quince)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub, grown for its dense clusters of beautiful long-lasting shell-pink flowers with conspicuous golden-yellow anthers. These are borne over a long period in late winter and appear before the leaves. They are followed by round yellow fruits. Often grown as a wall shrub to brighten the winter garden.

**Chamaecyparis lawsoniana 'Chilworth Silver'**

Slow growing medium-sized dense, upright columnar evergreen shrub, grown for its attractive soft sprays of feathery bright silvery grey-blue foliage, which look good all year round. Contact with foliage may irritate skin.

**Chamaecyparis lawsoniana 'Ellwood's Gold'**

Neat, small slow-growing conifer grown for its soft yellow-green foliage, gold-tipped in sun, which forms a small column.

**Chamaecyparis lawsoniana 'Ellwood's Pillar'**

Small, slow-growing narrow columnar evergreen conifer, which forms a column of attractive feathery blue-grey foliage. . Ideal for rock gardens.

**Chamaecyparis lawsoniana 'Ellwoodii'**

Medium slow-growing evergreen conifer which forms a column of feathery sprays of grey-green foliage, becoming steel-blue in winter. Sun or light shade.

**Chelone glabra (syn.obliqua var alba) (Turtlehead)**

Medium-sized erect perennial grown for its unusually-shaped heads of white or pink-tinged white flowers with white beards, borne from late summer to mid-autumn. The name "turtlehead" comes from the shape of the flowers. It is a showy plant for a late summer border, and can also be grown in a bog garden.

**Chelone obliqua (Turtlehead)**

Small upright perennial grown for its unusually shaped heads of pink flowers which are borne from August to October. The common name Turtlehead comes from the shape of the flowers. Prefers fertile acid soil. Tolerates damp conditions. Do not remove the dead flowerheads.

**Choisya 'Aztec Pearl'**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub with narrow green aromatic leaves grown for its pink buds which open into star-shaped white flowers in late spring. Ideal for a mixed border.

**Choisya 'White Dazzler'**

Compact medium-sized evergreen shrub with narrow aromatic dark green leaves, grown for its masses of scented white flowers produced in spring and again in early autumn. Requires a minimum of pruning, making it ideal for tubs and patio pots or mixed borders.

**Choisya ternata (Mexican Orange Blossom)**

Medium-sized evergreen rounded shrub, with aromatic glossy green leaves and white sweetly scented blooms in late spring and often again in early autumn. Ideal for screening or for a mixed border.

**Choisya ternata Sundance**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub grown for its bright yellow glossy aromatic foliage. and clusters of white flowers in late spring, and sometimes again in late summer if the first flower stems are removed after flowering. Ideal for a mixed or shrub border.If grown in light shade the leaves become a lovely yellow-green.



**Chrysanthemum 'Clara Curtis'**

Small clump-forming bushy perennial grown for its profusion of long-lasting single clear pink flowerheads borne from late summer to mid-autumn. The centres change from green to yellow as the flowers open. Ideal for a herbaceous border in a well-drained sunny site, and for cutting.

**Chrysanthemum 'Rosy Yoigloo'**

Medium-sized perennial with a neat habit, grown for its masses of coral-red flowers with light yellow centres which are borne from July until autumn frosts. Ideal for a sunny border.

**Chrysanthemum 'Sunny Yoigloo'**

Medium-sized perennial with a neat habit, grown for its masses of sunny lemon yellow flowers with light yellow centres which are borne from July until autumn frosts. Ideal for a sunny border.

**Chrysanthemum 'Warm Yoigloo'**

Medium-sized perennial with a neat habit, grown for its masses of bronze-orange flowers with yellow centres, which darken with age, and are borne from July until autumn frosts. Ideal for a sunny border.

**Cistus x argenteus 'Silver Pink' (Rock Rose)**

Small evergreen shrub with silvery-grey leaves and abundant clear pink flowers with golden stamens in early summer. Needs a well-drained sunny site. Drought tolerant. Ideal for a mixed border.

**Cistus x corbariensis (Rock Rose)**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub with wavy-edged aromatic dark green leaves and crimson-tinted buds, opening into pure white flowers with yellow centres in early summer. Tolerates dry conditions. Likes a sunny site. Ideal for a mixed border.

**Cistus x dansereau (Rock Rose)**

Small to medium evergreen shrub with long dark green leaves grown for its white saucer-shaped flowers with faint yellow or crimson marks at the base of each petal, borne profusely throughout the summer. Ideal for a sunny border, bank, base of a wall or in a container.

**Cistus x dansereau 'Decumbens' (Rock Rose)**

Attractive low spreading evergreen shrub with lance-shaped dark green leaves and a profusion of yellow-centred saucer-shaped white flowers with crimson blotches set against dark green leaves, from early to mid-summer. Tolerates dry conditions. Likes a sunny site. Ideal for a mixed border.

**Cistus x pulverulentus 'Sunset' (Rock Rose)**

Dwarf compact spreading evergreen shrub with grey-green leaves, grown for its profusion of vivid magenta-pink flowers with yellow centres borne throughout the summer. Ideal for a shrub border, sunny bank, base of wall, around paved areas or in a container. Pinch back after flowering to encourage a bushy habit.

**Cistus x purpureus (Rock Rose)**

Bushy rounded medium-sized evergreen shrub grown for its attractive large rosy-crimson flowers with chocolate basal blotches, which are set against dark green aromatic leaves. Drought tolerant. Likes a sunny site. Ideal for a mixed border.

## **Clematis**

See key to sizes inside front cover. A selection of varieties is available which change regularly. These include:-

### **Clematis 'Arabella'**

This unusual medium-sized perennial clematis is not a climber but produced upright stems bearing delightful small blue flowers all summer. The stems are best caned to keep tidy. Prune back in spring.

### **Clematis 'Bees' Jubilee'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber, bearing large mauve-pink flowers with carmine bars in May and June, and often again in August or September. Prune lightly in early spring and tidy again after first flowering to encourage a second crop of flowers.

### **Clematis 'Bill McKenzie'**

Vigorous large deciduous climber with bright green sharply toothed leaves, grown for its abundance of small bell-shaped single yellow flowers with red centres, borne from midsummer to late autumn, followed by large fluffy seedheads. Ideal for covering a wall, arbour, trellis or pergola, or for growing through small shrubs or large trees.

### **Clematis 'Carnaby'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber, grown for its profusion of large deep glowing pink flowers in May and June. Prefers partial shade. It can be grown in a container. Prune lightly in early spring and tidy again after first flowering to encourage a second crop of flowers.

### **Clematis 'Comtesse de Bouchaud'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber, grown for its lovely large bright rose-pink flowers with pale yellow centres, borne throughout the summer. Prune in early spring to keep a good shape.

### **Clematis 'Doctor Ruppel'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber grown for its very striking large deep rose-pink flowers with darker central bars and light chocolate anthers, produced over a long period. Especially attractive in late spring and early summer. Prefers a sunny site with its roots in the shade, and the roots need mulching. Cut back in late winter or early spring.

### **Clematis 'Ernest Markham'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber grown for its beautiful vivid glowing deep red flowers borne from July to October. Ideal for pergolas, trellises, sheds and walls. Needs hard pruning in February.

### **Clematis 'Etoile Violette'**

Medium to large deciduous climber with abundant lovely deep purple flowers from July to September. Can be grown in any aspect and is ideal for pergolas, arches, trellises and growing through trees and shrubs. Prune hard in spring.

### **Clematis 'Fireworks'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber, grown for its unusual attractive large mauve-blue flowers with red bars and centres born in May and June. Prune lightly and tidy after first flowering to encourage a second crop of flowers in August and September. Prefers a sheltered sunny site.

**Clematis 'Francis Rivis'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber which bears delightful small bell-shaped, slightly twisted mid-blue flowers from spring to early summer. These are followed by fluffy seed heads from late summer to autumn. Can be grown in any aspect. Useful for pots, trees, arches, walls and growing through shrubs. Does not require pruning but can be cut back to size after flowering if required.

**Clematis 'Hagley Hybrid'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber grown for its small shell-pink flowers from June to September. To keep a good shape, prune fairly hard in early spring.

**Clematis 'Jackmanii Superba'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber grown for its large dark violet flowers from July to September. This variety can be grown facing any direction. Ideal for walls, pergolas, pots and trellises. Prune fairly hard in early spring to keep a good shape.

**Clematis 'Marie Boisselot'**

Large deciduous climber grown for its large, pretty, white-cream flowers, which are produced from midsummer to late autumn. Fully hardy. Will grow in any aspect and is ideal for walls, pergolas, pots and trellises.

**Clematis 'Marjorie'**

Large deciduous climber grown for its cascades of semi-double creamy-pink flowers tinged with salmon-pink in April and May. Can be grown facing any direction. It is good for growing through trees and shrubs or on large walls and pergolas. No pruning necessary but can be cut back after flowering if required.

**Clematis 'Markham's Pink'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber with delightful small nodding pink and white flowers in April and May. Can be grown in any aspect and is good for pots, trees, trellises, pergolas, cut flowers or growing through shrubs. No pruning necessary but can be cut back after flowering if required.

**Clematis 'Miss Bateman'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber grown its beautiful rounded single white large flowers with red centres, which are produced freely in early summer. Ideal for pergolas, trellises, walls or going through shrubs. Trim back after flowering.

**Clematis 'Mrs N Thompson'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber, grown for its beautiful single deep violet flowers with vivid scarlet central bands and red centres, which are produced freely in early summer. Trim back to strong buds in early spring.

**Clematis 'Mrs Robert Brydon'**

This unusual medium-sized perennial clematis is not a climber but produces upright stems bearing masses of small, scented, lavender-blue flowers in late summer. The stems are best caned to keep tidy. Prune back in spring to 30 cm from the ground.

**Clematis 'Nelly Moser'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber bearing very large mauve flowers with pink bars in May and June and again in August and September. Prune lightly in early spring and tidy again after first flowering to encourage a second crop of flowers.

**Clematis 'Pixie'**

A new variety of evergreen climber, with attractive glossy green fern-like leaves and free flowering creamy-yellow bell-shaped flowers in late winter and early spring, followed by attractive seedheads.

**Clematis 'Rhapsody'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber grown for its lovely large deep blue single flowers borne from midsummer to early autumn. Can be cut back in March if necessary. Ideal for pergolas, trellises, walls or growing through shrubs.

**Clematis 'Rouge Cardinal'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber with crimson velvet flowers from June to September. Ideal for pergolas, trellises, sheds, pots and walls. Prune lightly in early spring and tidy again after flowering.

**Clematis 'Sunset'**

Small deciduous climber grown for its spectacular large cerise flowers with a vivid reddish-pink central stripe, borne in mid to late summer and making a spectacular splash of colour. This is a good variety for a small garden or patio. Cut back before growth begins in early spring.

**Clematis The President'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber with an abundance of large violet-purple flowers in June and again in September. Ideal for pergolas, trees, pots, cut flowers, walls, or growing through shrubs. Prune lightly in early spring and tidy again after flowering to encourage a second crop of flowers.

**Clematis 'Ville de Lyon'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber grown for its large bright carmine-red flowers with yellow anthers borne from July to October. Ideal for growing through an evergreen shrub, as its lower foliage can become scorched by late summer. Prune in early spring to keep shape.

**Clematis 'Vyvyan Pennell'**

Medium to large deciduous climber grown for its large double-lilac flowers and golden yellow anthers in early summer, followed by single blue-mauve flowers in mid-summer. Roots need shading.

**Clematis alpina 'Pamela Jackman'**

Medium-sized deciduous climber with small lantern-shaped mid-blue flowers in April and May, followed by fluffy seedheads. This variety can be grown facing any direction and is useful for pots, trees, arches, cut flowers, walls and growing through shrubs. Does not require pruning but can be cut back to size after flowering if required.

**Clematis armandii**

Large evergreen climber grown for its unusual lush dark green foliage and profuse clusters of highly-scented creamy-white flowers in March and April. Best grown on a south or west wall. No pruning required but can be trimmed to shape after flowering if necessary.

**Clematis armandii 'Snowdrift'**

Wonderful large strong-growing early-flowering climber with long dark green leaves, grown for its profuse clusters of saucer-shaped fragrant pure white flowers borne in late winter and early spring. Ideal for a warm sunny wall.

**Clematis montana var. grandiflora (The Mountain or Great Indian Clematis)**

Very large vigorous evergreen deciduous climber with masses of small white flowers in May and June. Ideal for any aspect including north-facing walls. Excellent for covering large areas quickly. No pruning necessary but can be cut back after flowering if required.

**Clematis montana var. rubens**

Large strong-growing deciduous climber grown for its profusion of rose-pink flowers borne throughout May and June, contrasting beautifully with its bronze-purple shoots and leaves. Ideal for any aspect, including north-facing walls, growing over trees, arbours and outhouses. Covers large areas quickly. No pruning necessary, but can be cut back after flowering.

**Clematis montana var. rubens 'Tetrarose'**

Very large vigorous evergreen deciduous climber with masses of small lilac-rose flowers in May and June. Ideal for any aspect including north-facing walls. Excellent for covering large areas quickly. No pruning necessary but can be cut back after flowering if required.

**Clematis tangutica**

Large vigorous deciduous climber with unusual small nodding yellow lantern-shaped flowers from July to October followed by fluffy seedheads. Can be grown in any aspect and used for growing through shrubs and on pergolas or walls. No pruning necessary but can be cut back after flowering if required.

**Convolvulus cneorum**

Small bushy evergreen shrub with attractive silky silvery leaves and pink-tinged buds which open to white flowers with yellow centres in early summer. Needs a sunny well-drained sheltered site. Silver foliage contrasts well in a mixed border.

**Cordyline 'Sunrise'**

Medium to large slow-growing palm-like evergreen shrub grown for its stunningly vibrant pink and bronze striped long narrow leaves. Adds a shock of colour to your garden. Ideal for a container, mixed or shrub border, or specimen plant in a sunny sheltered site.

**Cordyline australis (New Zealand Cabbage Palm)**

Large slow-growing palm-like evergreen shrub with long green sword-like leaves and large clusters of small scented white flowers in summer. Adds Mediterranean architectural feel to a garden. Ideal for containers in a sheltered sunny site.

**Cordyline australis 'Red Star'**

Large slow-growing palm-like evergreen shrub with beautiful long reddish sword-like leaves and clusters of small scented white flowers in summer. Adds Mediterranean architectural flavour to a garden. Ideal for containers in a sheltered sunny site.

**Cordyline australis 'Sparkler'**

Large slow-growing palm-like evergreen shrub grown for its long narrow green leaves with bright creamy variegated edges. Adds Mediterranean architectural flavour to a garden. Ideal for containers. Prefers a well-drained sheltered sunny site.

**Cornus alba 'Aurea' (Dogwood)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its lovely red stems in winter and bright yellow foliage in summer. Grows in all situations including boggy soil. Can be pruned hard in March to encourage fresh growth.

**Cornus alba 'Elegantissima' (v) (Dogwood)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its lovely red stems in winter and attractive white and green variegated foliage in summer. Grows in all situations including boggy soil. Can be pruned hard in March to encourage fresh growth.

**Cornus alba 'Sibirica' (Dogwood)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its brilliant young crimson shoots in winter and bright green leaves in summer. It bears attractive blue pea-sized berries in autumn. Grows in all situations including boggy soil. Can be pruned hard in March to encourage fresh growth.

**Cornus alba 'Spaethii' (v) (Dogwood)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its lovely red stems in winter and attractive gold and green variegated foliage in summer. Grows in all situations including boggy soil. Can be pruned hard in March to encourage fresh growth.

**Cornus sanguinea 'Midwinter Fire' (Dogwood)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub with golden yellow leaves, grown for its lovely winter stem colour . bright yellow at the base with vivid orange-red tips, giving the impression of a winter fire. Grows in all situations. Can be pruned hard in March to encourage fresh growth.

**Cornus sericea 'Flaviramea' (Dogwood)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub with mid-green leaves, grown for its stem colour . olive-green when young turning to a vivid gold in winter. Grows in all situations. Can be pruned hard in March to encourage fresh growth.

**Corokia cotoneaster**

Large rounded evergreen shrub grown for its attractive intricately shaped twigs and branches which resemble wire netting. It has small dark green leaves and small fragrant star-shaped yellow flowers in late spring followed by orange fruits. Ideal for a sheltered border or against a wall.

**Corokia x virgata (Wire Netting Bush)**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub with small greyish-green leaves on highly unusual irregularly-shaped branches. Small yellow starry flowers are sometimes followed by orange fruits. Best grown in a sheltered sunny well-drained site.

**Cortaderia selloana 'White Feather' (Pampas Grass)**

Large stately evergreen perennial grass with narrow sharp-edged green leaves grown for its long erect silvery plumes in late summer. Good for exposed coastal sites or near water.

**Cosmos atrosanguineus (Chocolate Cosmos)**

Unique medium perennial, grown for its deliciously chocolate-scented velvet-textured dark chocolate-red flowers which are borne from midsummer to autumn. Ideal for containers or borders. Mulch in autumn.

**Cosmos atrosanguineus 'Chocamocha'**

Delightful medium-sized perennial grown for its deliciously chocolate-scented velvet-textured dark chocolate-red flowers borne profusely from midsummer to autumn. This is a more compact and free-flowering version of the normal chocolate.

**Cotinus coggygria 'Royal Purple' (Smoke Bush)**

Large deciduous shrub grown for its showy light-purple foliage and the smoky cloud-like appearance of its flowers. Contrasts well in a mixed border.

**Cotoneaster horizontalis (Rock Spray)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub with small green leaves on branches that grow in a herringbone pattern. It has pinkish-white flowers in summer which are attractive to bees and are followed by abundant bright red berries in autumn. Grows in any soil or situation, often used as a wall shrub.

**Cotoneaster salicifolius 'Gnom'**

A low-growing spreading evergreen shrub with narrow glossy green leaves and bright red berries in autumn. Excellent ground cover which grows in any soil or situation.

**Cotoneaster x watereri**

Large evergreen shrub with long dark green leaves, grown for its large heads of white flowers in summer, followed by round red fruits. Can be grown in sun or partial shade in a sheltered site. Ideal for a shrub border or as a hedge or screen. Seeds may cause mild stomach upset if ingested.

**Crinodendron hookerianum**

Large evergreen shrub or small tree grown for its long dark green leaves and crimson to carmine-pink lantern-like flowers produced from late spring to late summer. Prefers a sheltered site. Ideal for a woodland garden or against a wall.

**Crocosmia x crocosmiiflora 'Emily McKenzie'**

Small to medium upright perennial with tall mid-green leaves, grown for its beautiful spikes of orange brown-throated flowers in late summer. Lift and divide large clumps in spring. An eye-catching addition to any garden. Prefers a sunny site.

**Crocosmia x crocosmiiflora 'George Davison'**

Medium-sized erect perennial with tall mid-green leaves. It is grown for its stunning spikes of bright yellow flowers in mid-summer. Lift and divide large clumps in spring. An eye-catching addition to any garden. Prefers a sunny site.

**Crocosmia x crocosmiiflora 'Fire Jumper'**

Medium-sized upright perennial with long bright green leaves, grown for its beautiful spikes of large funnel-shaped yellow to orange-yellow flowers with orange markings in the centres; borne from midsummer to mid-autumn. Mulch during heavy frost, can be lifted and divided in spring. An eye-catching addition to any garden.

**Crocoshia x crocosmiiflora 'Star of the East'**

One of the most spectacular varieties of this medium-sized upright perennial with long bright green leaves, grown for its beautiful spikes of huge clear orange flowers with paler centres; borne from midsummer to mid-autumn. Mulch during heavy frost, can be lifted and divided in spring. An eye-catching addition to any garden.

**Crocoshia x latifolia 'Lucifer'**

Medium-sized erect perennial with tall mid-green leaves. It is grown for its stunning spikes of bright red flowers in mid-summer. Mulch in the first winter and during heavy frost. Lift and divide large clumps in spring. An eye-catching addition to any garden. Prefers a sunny site.

**Cryptomeria japonica 'Vilmoriniana'**

Slow-growing dwarf conifer grown for its dense green leaves turning reddish-purple in autumn. Ideal for rock gardens or troughs.

**x Cupressocyparis leylandii (Leyland Cypress)**

Exceedingly fast-growing upright conifer, with green foliage which can be trimmed to form a dense hedge or screen. It will grow 2 to 3 feet per year to a maximum height of 100 feet and is best trimmed at least once a year. Contact with foliage may aggravate skin allergies. Ideal for hedging.

**x Cupressocyparis leylandii 'Castlewellan'**

Fast-growing upright conifer, with yellow foliage which can be trimmed to form a dense green hedge or screen. It will grow 2 to 3 feet per year to a maximum height of 100 feet and is best trimmed at least once a year. Contact with foliage may aggravate skin allergies. Ideal for hedging.

**Cupressus macrocarpa 'Goldcrest'**

Medium-sized narrow columnar upright evergreen conifer or tree, grown for its sprays of bright golden-yellow foliage, providing all year round colour. Prefers a sheltered sunny well-drained site. Ideal for seaside planting, often used as hedging.

**Cynara cardunculus (Cardoon)**

Striking large perennial with spiny, silvery-grey leaves, grown for its tall large purple flowerheads from early summer to early autumn. A stunning architectural feature in a herbaceous border, this plant is very attractive to bees and makes magnificent dried flowers. Related to the artichoke, the leaf-stalks can be blanched and eaten. Protect with mulch in very cold winters.

**Cyrtomium fortunei var. clivicola**

Small evergreen fern with spreading broad leathery green fronds. Ideal for a shady herbaceous border. Remove old fronds in spring and feed from late spring to midsummer to promote large lush fronds. Mulch in severe weather.

**Cytisus 'Goldfinch' (Broom)**

Medium to large strong growing deciduous shrub grown for the masses of bright red and yellow flowers borne in spring and early summer. Thrives in poor soil. Prefers a sunny well-drained sheltered site. Ideal for a shrub border. May cause mild stomach upset if eaten.



**Cytisus x praecox 'Albus' (Broom)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its masses of showy white flowers in April and May. One of the smaller brooms, it will tolerate poor soils and thrive in dry sunny areas.

**Cytisus x praecox 'Allgold' (Broom)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its masses of showy deep yellow flowers in April and May. One of the smaller brooms, it will tolerate poor soils and thrive in dry sunny areas.

**Dahlia 'Bishop of Auckland'**

Very decorative small perennial grown for its profusion of large peony-like deep red flowers which contrast well with its dark foliage, and are borne from midsummer to autumn. Looks stunning in a fertile sunny border. Dead head to prolong flowering.

**Dahlia 'Bishop of Canterbury'**

Highly decorative small to medium perennial grown for its profusion of wine red flowers which contrast beautifully with the dark foliage. The flowers are produced from midsummer to autumn and look stunning in a border. Prefers a sunny well-drained site.

**Dahlia 'Bishop of Llandaff'**

Highly decorative medium to large perennial grown for its profusion of large bright red flowers which contrast well with its dark black-red leaves. The flowers are produced from midsummer to first frosts and are stunning in a border. Prefers a fertile site with some sun. Cut back after flowering.

**Dahlia 'Bishop of York'**

Very decorative medium-sized perennial grown for its stunning flowers produced from early summer to early autumn, which are dark pumpkin orange at the base, fading to lighter orange at the tips, with deep brown centres, and which contrast strikingly with the dark purple foliage. Ideal for a well-drained sunny site. Deadhead to prolong flowering.

**Dahlia 'Candy Eyes'**

Very decorative small to medium perennial, grown for its pale pink flowers with a magenta stripe down the middle of each petal, which contrast well with its lace-like deep mahogany to black foliage. The flowers are produced from midsummer to first frosts and look stunning in a border. Ideal for a fertile sunny site. Cut back after flowering.

**Dahlia 'Dreamy Fusion'**

Very decorative medium-sized perennial grown for its large vibrant pink flowers which vary from pale to dark rose in colour and have bright yellow centres with white radiating from them. The flowers are produced from May to October and contrast beautifully with the bronze foliage. Ideal for a fertile sunny border or container. Cut back after flowering.

**Dahlia 'Knockout' (syn. Mystic Illusion)**

Very decorative medium-sized perennial, grown for its large bright yellow-ribbed sunflower-like flowers with prominent orange centres and black lacquered foliage, which are produced from midsummer to first frosts and look stunning in a border. Ideal for a fertile sunny site. Cut back after flowering.

**Dahlia 'Moonfire'**

Very decorative medium-sized perennial grown for its wonderful combination of bronze foliage and stunning golden yellow flowers with red centres, which are produced from midsummer to first frosts. Ideal for a fertile sunny site, looks stunning in a border. Cut back after flowering.

**Dahlia 'Mystic Enchantment'**

Highly decorative medium-sized perennial, grown for its profusion of vivid scarlet ribbed flowers which fade with age to a warm burnt orange and contrast beautifully with the dark mahogany foliage. The flowers are produced from midsummer to first frosts and look stunning in a sunny border. Deadhead to prolong flowering.

**Dahlia 'Mystic Fantasy' (syn Hawaiian Dreams)**

Highly decorative medium-sized perennial, grown for its profusion of stunning flamingo pink flowers, soft yellow at the base with a raspberry eye, produced from midsummer until autumn, which are set off beautifully by the glossy mahogany-black foliage. Ideal for a sunny border. Deadhead to prolong flowering.

**Dahlia 'Mystic Haze' (syn Dark Side of the Sun)**

Highly decorative medium to large perennial, grown for its stunning flowers which open yellow and change with age to a mixture of red, orange and yellow, and are borne from midsummer until autumn. They contrast well with the dark bronze foliage.

**Dahlia 'Twyning's After Eight'**

Highly decorative medium-sized perennial, grown for its profusion of single white pink-flushed flowers with orange-yellow centres, which are borne from midsummer to autumn and contrast beautifully with the chocolate-coloured to deep purple foliage. Looks stunning in a sunny border. Deadhead to prolong flowering.

**Daphne odora 'Aureomarginata' (v)**

A delightful medium-sized evergreen shrub with attractive dark green leaves that have creamy-white margins, grown for its very highly fragrant purple-pink flowers from late winter to early spring. Best planted in fertile well-drained soil. Toxic if eaten.

**Deschampsia cespitosa (Tufted hair grass or tussock grass)**

Small evergreen with long narrow bridge green leaves in dense clumps, which is grown for its glistening silver-tinted purple flowerheads borne on very tall graceful stalks from early to late summer. Ideal for a border, or a wildflower garden.

**Deutzia x magnifica**

Medium to large deciduous shrub grown for its masses of beautiful double white star-shaped flowers which cover the whole bush from mid-spring to mid-summer. Ideal for a shrub border or as a specimen plant in a sunny spot. Prune back after flowering.

**Dianella tasmanica**

Medium-sized tufted perennial, forming clumps of phormium-like, strap-shaped stiff leaves. Star-shaped lavender-blue flowers are produced in early summer, followed by long-lasting dark blue berries. Grow in a woodland garden or a warm sheltered site.

**Dianthus deltoides 'Brilliant' (Maiden Pink)**

Small mat-forming perennial with dark narrow green leaves grown for its profusion of small bright cerise pink flowers borne through spring and summer. Deadhead to prolong flowering. Ideal for a sunny border.

**Dicentra eximia (Wild bleeding heart)**

Delightful low-growing perennial grown for its attractive delicate fern-like greenish-blue foliage and unusual heart-shaped pink and white flowers in late spring and early summer. Thrives in shady conditions, dies down to ground level in winter.

**Dicentra spectabilis (Bleeding heart)**

Popular medium-sized clump-forming perennial grown for its attractive sprays of heart-shaped deep pink flowers with white insides, which are borne in late spring and early summer. Prefers a moist fertile site in sun or shade. Dies down to ground level in winter. May cause mild stomach upset if eaten. Contact with foliage may aggravate skin allergies.

**Dicentra spectabilis 'Alba'**

Popular medium clump-forming perennial grown for its attractive sprays of heart-shaped white flowers with white insides which are borne in late spring and early summer. Prefers a moist fertile site in sun or shade. Dies down to ground level in winter. May cause mild stomach upset if eaten. Contact with foliage may aggravate skin allergies.

**Dierama pulcherrimum (Angel's Fishing Rod)**

Medium-sized semi-evergreen perennial grown for its tall spikes of tubular bell-shaped pale to deep magenta-pink flowers borne in dense hanging clusters in summer. Prefers a well-drained sunny site in a sheltered position. Ideal for a border or by a pool or stream.

**Digitalis x mertonensis 'Summer King' (Foxglove)**

Small to medium perennial grown for its attractive short spikes of tawny old-rose coloured richly spotted bell-shaped flowers in late spring or early summer. Ideal for a border in almost any situation. May cause severe discomfort if ingested. Contact with the foliage may irritate skin.

**Digitalis purpurea 'Pam's Choice' (Foxglove)**

Medium-sized perennial of the foxglove family, grown for its profusion of very attractive creamy white bell-shaped flowers with spotted dark red throats borne throughout the summer, contrasting with the grey-green foliage. Ideal for a cottage garden border in almost any situation. May cause severe discomfort if ingested. Contact with foliage may irritate skin.

**Dryopteris:**

A selection of hardy semi-evergreen ferns are available

**Echinacea purpurea (Coneflower)**

Medium-sized perennial grown for its stunning large purplish-red daisy-like flowers with golden brown cone-shaped centres which are borne from mid-summer to early autumn. Ideal for a mixed border, for that cottage garden feel. Prefers a sunny site.

**Echinacea purpurea 'Double Decker'**

Small to medium perennial, grown for its stunning unusual large pinkish-purple flowerheads with golden-brown centres, which often produce a second set of petals from the centre, and are borne from midsummer to autumn. Prefers a sunny site. Ideal for a herbaceous border. Cut back stems as flowers fade to encourage further flowering.

**Echinacea purpurea 'Magnus'**

Medium perennial grown for its profusion of large deep purple-red daisy like flowers with prominent dark orange cone-shaped centres, borne on stiff stems over a long period in summer and early autumn. The petals are more horizontal than other varieties. Ideal for a sunny well drained border. Cut back dead flower stems in autumn.

**Echinacea purpurea 'White Swan' (Coneflower)**

Medium to large perennial grown for its profusion of white daisy-like flowers which golden brown cone-shaped centres, borne freely from midsummer to first frosts. Highly attractive to butterflies. Ideal for a perennial border or large container.

**Elaeagnus x ebbingei**

Large fast-growing evergreen shrub with grey-green leaves which have silvery undersides and small white highly fragrant flowers in autumn. Ideal for hedging, especially in seaside areas.

**Elaeagnus pungens 'Maculata' (v)**

Medium to large evergreen shrub with attractive dark green margined leaves with dark yellow centres and small white highly fragrant flowers in autumn followed by brown fruit which ripen to red. Useful for seaside areas, a good specimen shrub or for a border.

**Ensete ventricosum 'Maurelii'**

Large banana-like fast-growing evergreen perennial grown for its huge paddle-shaped bright olive-green leaves, red above, and dark red leaf stalks. Very long heads of white flowers, bronze-red outside, throughout summer. Produces inedible banana-like fruits. Ideal specimen plants in courtyard, or gives subtropical effects in summer bedding. Protect from frost.

**Eragrostis spectabilis (Purple Love Grass or Tumble)**

Small clump-forming grass, forming a neat mound of fine foliage. Grown for its delightful fine airy flower plumes, which appear in August and September like reddish-purple clouds. Dies down in winter in colder areas. Ideal for a sunny site. Will grow well in poor dry sites. Ideal for a mixed or herbaceous border, or a rock garden.

**Eryngium planum (Sea Holly)**

Medium evergreen perennial with dark green leaves at the base and blue-tinted ones on the stem. It is grown for its beautiful clusters of light blue thistle-like flowers with blue-green bracts, borne from mid-summer to early autumn. Prefers a dry sunny site. Ideal for a long-lasting display in a border, or for naturalising.

**Eryngium planum 'Blue Glitter' (Sea Holly)**

Attractive medium evergreen perennial with dark green leaves at the base and blue-tinted ones on the stem. It is grown for its unusual intensely blue thistle-like flowerheads borne over a long period in summer and autumn. Prefers a dry sunny site. Ideal for a long-lasting display in a border, or for naturalising.

**Eryngium planum 'Blue Hobbit' (Sea Holly)**

Attractive compact form of this perennial grown for its unusual blue-grey thistle-like heads, which flower over three months in summer and are followed by attractive seed heads. Prefers a sunny site. Ideal for a pot or front of border.

**Eryngium variifolium (Sea Holly)**

Small low-growing evergreen perennial, grown for its dark green leaves with conspicuous white veins and heads of blue-grey flowers with silvery-white bases, borne in mid to late summer. The foliage becomes prickly later in the year. Ideal for a rock garden. Prefers a sunny site. Provides a long-lasting display.

**Erysimum 'Bowles's Mauve'**

Small compact evergreen hardy perennial with grey-green leaves grown for its abundant spikes of mauve flowers borne from late spring to early autumn. Ideal for a sunny well-drained border. Cut back in spring to encourage compact growth.

**Escallonia 'Apple Blossom'**

Slow-growing medium-sized evergreen shrub grown for its glossy green leaves and a profusion of pink and white apple-blossom-like flowers throughout summer. Good in coastal areas. Ideal as a flowering hedge for a shrub border or against a wall.

**Escallonia 'Iveyi'**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub grown for its glossy dark green leaves setting off large clusters of tubular white flowers throughout summer. Ideal for a shrub border, against a wall, or as a hedge or screen or windbreak.

**Escallonia laevis 'Gold Ellen' (v)**

Medium-sized semi-evergreen shrub grown for its large pink flowers and bright yellow foliage, occasionally with a central green splash. Prefers a sheltered site. Ideal for a border.

**Escallonia rubra 'Crimson Spire'**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub grown for its glossy dark green leaves and bright crimson flowers throughout summer. Excellent for coastal gardens as a hedge, screen or windbreak or in a shrub border.

**Escallonia rubra var. macrantha**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub grown for its glossy green leaves and rose-red flowers in summer. Excellent for coastal gardens as a hedge, screen or windbreak or in a border. Likes a sunny sheltered site.

**Eucalyptus gunnii (Cider Gum)**

Evergreen tree or large shrub with attractive round silver-blue leaves when young, blue-green when mature. It has peeling cream and brown bark. It can reach a large tree size, but will remain an attractive bush if regularly pruned.

**Eucomis bicolor (Pineapple Flower)**

Wonderful small bulbous perennial with maroon-flecked glossy green leaves and stems. It is grown for its unusual long clustered heads of star-shaped purple-margined pale green flowers. The flowerheads are topped with a small tuft of green leaves, similar to a pineapple. Needs a sunny sheltered site or the base of a warm wall.

**Eucomis comosa**

Small to medium bulbous perennial grown for its stunning appearance. Thick fleshy rich purple leaves in a spear-like rosette surround long spikes of star-shaped pink-purple flowers, topped with a pineapple-like tuft in late summer. Ideal for a specimen container plant or in a border. Needs a sunny sheltered site.

**Eucomis comosa 'Oakhurst'**

Small to medium bulbous perennial grown for its stunning appearance. Thick fleshy rich purple leaves in a spear-like rosette surrounding long spikes of star-shaped pink-purple flowers topped with a pineapple-like tuft in late summer. Ideal for a specimen container plant or in a border. Needs a sunny sheltered site.

**Euonymus alatus (Winged Spindle)**

Medium to large deciduous shrub or small tree grown for its green leaves which turn a brilliant crimson in autumn providing a spectacular splash of colour, and for its unusual and attractive pink and orange berries. Harmful if eaten.

**Euonymus fortunei 'Emerald Gaiety' (v)**

Small evergreen shrub grown for its deep green leaves with white margins which become attractively pink-tinged during winter. Ideal in a mixed border or can be used as a wall shrub. Tolerant of most conditions. Harmful if eaten.

**Euonymus fortunei 'Emerald 'n' Gold' (v)**

Small evergreen shrub grown for its bright golden and green variegated leaves which become attractively pink-tinged during winter. Ideal in a mixed border or can be used as a wall shrub. Tolerant of most conditions. Harmful if eaten.

**Euonymus fortunei 'Harlequin'**

Small compact evergreen shrub grown for its small leaves, which are heavily speckled pure white and light green, and its pure white young growth. Ideal for a mixed border in a sunny site. Harmful if eaten.

**Euonymus fortunei 'Silver Queen' (v)**

Medium to large evergreen shrub grown for its attractive green leaves with white margins, which become pink-tinged during winter. Ideal in a mixed border, or can be trained as a climber against a shady wall or through a tree. Harmful if eaten.

**Euonymus japonicus 'Ovatus Aureus' (v)**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub grown for its green leaves suffused with creamy-yellow. A popular plant for a mixed border. Harmful if eaten.

**Euphorbia 'Redwing' (syn 'Charam')**

Small to medium clump-forming herbaceous perennial with blue-green leaves, red in winter, grown for its clusters of bright lime-yellow cup-shaped flowerheads borne in spring. Green buds appear in late autumn, turning red before opening. Provides early spring colour in mixed border in well-drained sunny site. Attracts insects. Harmful if eaten, skin and eye irritant.

**Euphorbia amygdaloides 'Purpurea' (Wood Spurge)**

Small semi-evergreen perennial with attractive dark reddish-purple foliage and clusters of unusual sulphur-yellow flowerheads in spring. Fully hardy and will tolerate shady conditions. Milky sap can severely irritate skin and eyes.

**Euphorbia amygdaloides var. robbiae**

Medium-sized evergreen perennial grown for its neat rosettes of dark green leaves which contrast well with the clusters of unusual greenish-yellow flowers borne from March to May. Ideal for ground cover under shade, it is a plant which establishes well. Milky sap can severely irritate skin and eyes.

**Euphorbia characias subsp. wulfenii**

Medium-sized evergreen clump-forming perennial with mid-green leaves on upright stems. It is grown for its unusual yellow-green flowerheads which are produced from early spring to early summer. Fully hardy and will tolerate shady conditions. Milky sap can severely irritate skin and eyes.

**Euphorbia x martini**

Small evergreen clump-forming perennial, with green purple-tinged leaves and clusters of unusual lemon-green flowerheads with a red eye from spring to mid-summer. Fully hardy and will tolerate shady conditions. Milky sap can severely irritate skin and eyes.

**Fagus sylvatica (common beech for hedging)**

This large deciduous spreading tree makes a lovely hedge. The leaves are pale green in early spring, turning glossy dark green, then yellow to orange-brown in autumn. The brown leaves will remain over winter if pruned in midsummer.

**Fagus sylvatica Atropurpurea group (copper beech for hedging)**

This large deciduous spreading tree makes a lovely hedge. The leaves are pale green in early spring, turning glossy dark green, then yellow to orange-brown in autumn. The brown leaves will remain over winter if pruned in midsummer.

**Fallopia baldschuanica (Russian Vine or Mile-a-minute)**

Large extremely vigorous deciduous climber. It is covered with white and pink flowers in summer and autumn. This tough climber is ideal for fast coverage of sheds, trees, walls, pagodas etc.

**Fargesia nitida**

Large slow-growing bamboo forming dense clumps of dark purple-green canes. Produces cascades of lance-shaped dark green leaves. Prefers partial or dappled shade and shelter from wind. An excellent specimen or large container plant.

**Fascicularia bicolor**

A rosette-forming perennial with slender, spiny-toothed deep green leaves. In summer the innermost leaves turn bright crimson, and the rosette bears pretty pale blue and white flowers.

**x Fatshedera lizei (Tree Ivy)**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub which forms a mound of dark green glossy leaves or can be trained as an evergreen climber. Sprays of small white flowers appear in autumn. Tolerant of shade, coastal exposure and pollution. Can be grown as a houseplant.

**Fatsia japonica (Japanese Aralia)**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub with large exotic glossy green leaves set off in autumn by milk-white flowers followed by round black fruits. Prefers a sheltered partially shaded site. Ideal for adding a sub-tropical feel to the garden. Also suitable for large patio pots.

**Festuca glauca 'Elijah Blue'**

Popular small evergreen tuft-forming perennial grass grown for its stunning silvery-blue foliage. Ideal in rockeries or planted into gravel, or for edging a bed.

**Ficus 'Brunswick' (Common fig)**

Deciduous tree or large shrub with very large leaves and delicious edible fruit, green when young, maturing to dark green, purple or dark brown. Ideal as a specimen tree in a sheltered site. In small gardens it needs to be contained. Foliage may cause mild stomach upset if ingested, sap may irritate skin.

**Ficus carica 'Brown Turkey' (f)**

The Common Fig. Large deciduous wall shrub or small tree with handsome, very large-lobed leaves and delicious edible fruit which are green when young, maturing to dark purple-brown. Foliage can cause skin irritation in sunlight.

**Forsythia x intermedia 'Lynwood Variety'**

Medium to large deciduous shrub, grown for its profusion of rich yellow flowers which appear in early spring before the leaves. Ideal for brightening the garden in March and April. Grow in a shrub border, on a bank, against a wall, as a hedge or specimen plant.

**Francoa sonchifolia (Bridal Wreath)**

Small to medium evergreen clump-forming perennial with deep green leaves at the base, grown for its spikes of pale pink flowers with dark pink markings, which open from deep pink buds in midsummer. Ideal for edging for a border, or for a woodland or courtyard garden. Often used in floral arrangements. Protect from winter wet and hard frosts.

**Fremontodendron 'California Glory' (Flannel Bush)**

Large vigorous upright, then spreading, evergreen shrub with dark green leaves and stunning large saucer-shaped yellow flowers from summer to autumn. Requires full sun and good drainage in sheltered site, excellent on chalk soils. Grown against a warm wall, or at the back of a shrub border. Contact with foliage and shoots may irritate skin.

**Fuchsia 'Genii'**

Small deciduous hardy shrub with attractive lime-yellow leaves which become bright yellow in sun. Throughout the summer it produces an abundance of dainty red and purple flowers. Ideal in sun or light shade. Trim back dead wood in spring.

**Fuchsia 'Lady Boothby'**

Deciduous climber known as ~~the world's~~ first climbing fuchsia. Grown for its striking bright pink and purple two-tone flowers and red stems. Fast growing and ideal for covering trellis, arches, walls or fences. Needs support.



**Fuchsia 'Lady Thumb'**

Small deciduous hardy shrub grown for its abundant red and white semi-double flowers. It flowers continuously from summer to first frosts. Ideal in sun or light shade. Trim back dead wood in spring.

**Fuchsia 'Madame Cornelissen' (Hardy bush fuchsia)**

Small to medium compact deciduous shrub, grown for its lovely contrasting scarlet and white semi-double flowers produced profusely over a long period throughout the summer. Ideal for beds, borders and patio containers. Prefers moist soil in part shade.

**Fuchsia 'Mrs Popple'**

Small to medium deciduous hardy shrub, grown for its attractive scarlet and purple flowers produced over a long period throughout the summer. Ideal in sun or light shade. Trim back dead wood in spring.

**Fuchsia 'Riccartonii'**

Medium deciduous hardy shrub with green leaves which turn reddish purple later in the year. It is covered with dainty red and purple flowers throughout the summer until first frosts. Ideal in a mixed border or as a flowering hedge in sun or light shade. Trim back dead wood in spring

**Fuchsia 'Son of Thumb'**

Small deciduous shrub, one of the hardy fuchsias, grown for its profusion of cerise-pink and lilac flowers borne over a long period throughout the summer and autumn. Will thrive in sun or shade in any well-drained soil.

**Fuchsia 'Sunray' (v)**

Small deciduous hardy shrub grown for its attractive yellow, pink and green leaves, set off by abundant dainty red flowers throughout the summer. Ideal in sun or light shade.

**Fuchsia 'Tom Thumb'**

Small deciduous hardy shrub grown for its abundant scarlet and violet flowers produced from July to October. Ideal in sun or light shade. Trim back dead wood in spring.

**Fuchsia 'Tom West'**

Small deciduous hardy shrub grown for its attractively variegated green pink and white leaves, and small dainty red flowers in spring and summer. Ideal for a pot or front of border in sun or light shade.

**Fuchsia 'Whiteknights Blush'**

Medium-sized deciduous hardy shrub grown for its very dainty pale pink flowers which cover the plant for a long period throughout the summer. Ideal in sun or light shade. Trim back dead wood in spring.

**Fuchsia x bacillaris**

Small deciduous hardy shrub grown for its profusion of minute white, pink or crimson flowers - the colour varies according to the amount of sun. These are sometimes followed by shiny black fruits. The small leaves are glossy and dark green. Ideal for a rock garden or hanging basket in sun or light shade. Trim back dead wood in spring.

**Fuchsia magellanica 'Versicolor' (v)**

Medium-sized deciduous hardy shrub with unusual pink-tinged grey-green leaves. It produces an abundance of reddish-purple flowers throughout summer and autumn. Ideal in sun or light shade. Trim back dead wood in spring.

**Gaillardia 'Arizona Sun' (Blanket flower)**

Attractive small perennial, grown for the masses of brilliant red daisy-flowers with yellow tips, which are produced over a long period from summer to autumn. This is a lovely small compact and highly colourful variety which will thrive in most situations. Looks best in a sunny border. Dead head regularly to prolong flowering. Cut back after flowering.

**Gaillardia x grandiflora 'Kobold' (syn Goblin)**

Attractive small perennial grown for its masses of daisy like flowers, which are red with yellow tips, and are borne above low mounds of grey-green foliage from early summer to early autumn. Ideal for a well drained sunny border. Remove dead flowerheads to prolong flowering.

**Gaura 'Passionate Blush'**

Stunning elegant dwarf perennial grown for its slender spikes of dark pink flowers standing above crimson leaves from midsummer to first frosts. Ideal for patio planters and the front of borders. Prefers a well-drained sunny site in light soil.

**Gaura 'Passionate Rainbow'**

Stunning small perennial, grown for its delicately variegated foliage with soft pink flowers with a darker eye. Ideal for a well-drained sunny planter or border.

**Gaura 'Pink Gin'**

Stunning small perennial, grown for its delicately variegated foliage with creamy edged white flowers and its masses of pink flowers with a darker eye. Ideal for a well-drained sunny planter or border.

**Gaura 'Rosyjane'**

Stunning large perennial grown for its masses of white flowers with pink "picotee" edges produced freely in summer and autumn. Ideal for the middle of a sunny border.

**Gaura 'Tutti Frutti'**

Small to medium compact perennial grown for its masses of small shocking hot pink flowers produced freely from summer to autumn. A graceful plant for a border. Prefers a dry sunny site. May be divided in spring.

**Gaura lindheimeri 'Crimson Butterflies'**

Small to medium perennial with grey-green leaves grown for its masses of crimson flowers produced freely from summer to autumn, opening at dawn from pink buds. Ideal for a pot or border. Prefers a dry sunny site.

**Genista hispanica**

Small mound-forming spiny deciduous shrub grown for its profusion of bright golden-yellow pea-like flowers in late spring and early summer. Ideal for a sunny spot. Cut back after flowering.

**Genista lydia**

Small deciduous shrub with slender arching branches which are covered in masses of bright yellow pea-like flowers in May and June. Ideal for sunny borders. Thrives in dry soil.

**Geranium (Cranesbill):**

A selection of hardy herbaceous perennial varieties are usually available.

**Geum 'Lady Stratheden' (Goldball)**

Medium-sized perennial grown for its attractive display of semi-double rich golden yellow flowers borne throughout the summer. Ideal for the front of a well-drained sunny border.

**Geum 'Mrs J Bradshaw'**

Attractive small perennial with hairy leaves, grown for its masses of semi-double scarlet flowers produced throughout the summer. Ideal for the front of a border in a sunny site. Divide in spring.

**Gladiolus 'Hunting Song'**

Medium-sized bulbous perennial with sword-like leaves, grown for its spectacular tall spikes of large orange-red trumpet-shaped flowers borne from July to October. Ideal for a sunny well-drained site in a herbaceous border or a container. Excellent for cut flowers.

**Grevillea rosmarinifolia 'Jenkinsii'**

Large evergreen shrub with narrow grey-green rosemary-like leaves, grown for its long heads of honeysuckle-like pink and white flowers from late summer to early autumn. Ideal hedging plant or for a shrub border. May aggravate skin allergies.

**Griselinia littoralis (Broadleaf)**

Fast-growing vigorous, large evergreen shrub grown for its beautiful glossy leathery bright apple-green leaves. An ideal hedging plant, which forms a beautiful dense hedge if kept trimmed. Prefers a sunny sheltered site.

**Griselinia littoralis 'Variegata' (v)**

Medium-sized fast-growing evergreen shrub grown for its beautiful glossy green leaves with creamy-white margins. It can be trimmed to form a lovely dense hedge. Prefers a sunny sheltered site.

**Gunnera manicata**

A bold and striking large perennial, grown for its massive dark green leaves. It has unusual flower spikes in early summer followed by orange-brown seedpods. Leaves die down to the ground in winter when crowns should be protected. Excellent, very striking architectural plant for the edge of a pond, stream or bog garden.

**Hakonechloa macra 'Alboraurea'**

A small, very attractive graceful clump-forming deciduous perennial grass grown for its mounds of green-striped bright yellow leaves which turn reddish-brown in autumn. Ideal for the front of a border, or a woodland or rock garden, or for containers.

**Halimium calycinum**

Small evergreen shrub, grown for its narrow dark green leaves which set off the profusion of small bright yellow flowers produced in early summer. Ideal for the front of a border, rock garden or container. Prefers a sunny sheltered site.

**Hebe 'Baby Marie'**

Small evergreen shrub grown for its small dark green leaves and profusion of pale lilac flowers in early and mid summer. An ideal plant for patio pots, rockeries and low borders.

**Hebe Bowles's Hybrid'**

Dwarf evergreen shrub with glossy mid-green leaves, grown for its profusion of lavender-purple flowers throughout the summer. Ideal for a rock garden.

**Hebe 'Charming White'**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub grown for its green leaves and profuse white flower spikes in early and midsummer. Ideal for a mixed border in summer.

**Hebe 'Marjorie'**

Small compact rounded evergreen shrub with purple-brown shoots and dark green leaves, red-purple when young, with brown-purple midribs. It bears medium-sized violet-blue flowers in late summer. Ideal for a mixed or shrub border.

**Hebe 'Mrs Winder'**

Small compact rounded evergreen shrub with purple-brown shoots and dark green leaves, red-purple when young, with brown-purple midribs. It bears medium-sized violet-blue flowers in late summer. Ideal for a mixed or shrub border.

**Hebe 'Nicola's Blush'**

Delightful small evergreen shrub with dark bronze-green leaves and profuse spikes of pinkish-white flowers throughout the summer and autumn. Ideal in sunny borders.

**Hebe 'Pink Fantasy'**

Small to medium evergreen shrub grown for its narrow deep green leaves and pink flowers throughout summer. A good trouble-free shrub ideal for a border. Keep moist during dry weather.

**Hebe 'Red Edge'**

Attractive small evergreen shrub grown for its blue-grey leaves with narrow red margins which have a burgundy hue throughout the winter and covering of lavender flowers in early summer which fade to white. Ideal for the front of a sunny border or as a patio plant.

**Hebe 'Sapphire'**

Small evergreen shrub grown for its long spikes of rose-purple flowers borne throughout summer and autumn, which contrast beautifully with the slender red-tinged leaves. Will grow in any well-drained soil. Attractive in the front of a border.

**Hebe 'White Gem'**

Small compact evergreen shrub grown for its profusion of small white flowers in early and mid summer. Ideal for a border.

**Hebe 'Wiri Charm'**

Small compact evergreen shrub with spear-shaped dark green leaves, grown for its rich rose-purple flowers in summer, which can last through until winter, and its deep burgundy foliage in winter. Ideal for a border or large patio container.

**Hebe albicans**

Small dense evergreen shrub with blue-grey foliage covered with small tight clusters of white flowers from early to mid-summer. Ideal for patios, troughs, or the front of sunny borders.

**Hebe brachysiphon**

Medium to large evergreen shrub with dark green leaves, grown for its stunning display of small white flowers in early to mid summer. Ideal for a border or hedge.

**Hebe odora (syn. Hebe buxifolia)**

Small to medium-sized evergreen bushy shrub with an attractive dense glossy green leaves, grown for its display of white flowers throughout the summer. Ideal for a border.

**Hebe pinguifolia Pagei**

Small evergreen shrub grown for its blue-grey leaves and masses of small white flowers in late spring. Ideal for rock gardens, patio pots or the front of sunny borders.

**Hebe pinguifolia 'Sutherlandii'**

Small dense evergreen shrub which forms a rounded silver mound of small attractive grey-green leaves. Bears a profusion of small white flowers in early summer. Ideal for the front of a border or ground cover.

**Hebe rakaiensis**

A small very hardy rounded evergreen shrub forming a dense mound of small neat apple-green leaves which is covered in white flowers from early to midsummer. Ideal for sunny borders.

**Hebe salicifolia**

Medium-sized vigorous evergreen shrub grown for its bright green leaves and slender spikes of white or pale lilac flowers in summer. Ideal for a quick-flowering hedge.

**Hebe topiaria**

Small evergreen shrub grown for its neat grey-green leaves and short clusters of pretty white flowers in summer. Ideal for rockeries and the front of borders.

**Hebe vernicosa**

Small evergreen shrub grown for its glossy bright green leaves and slender spikes of white flowers from late spring to summer. Its neat habit is ideal for rock gardens.

**Helenium 'Moerheim Beauty' (Sneezewort)**

Medium-sized herbaceous perennial grown for its masses of large bright daisy-like copper-red flowers in late summer from July to September. Ideal for a sunny mixed or herbaceous border. Deadhead to prolong flowering and deadhead clumps every few years. May cause discomfort if eaten. Contact with foliage may aggravate skin allergies.

**Helenium 'Ruby Tuesday'**

Compact perennial grown for its profusion of dark red flowers with yellow centres, borne throughout the summer and contrasting well with bright green leaves. Ideal for a sunny, mixed or herbaceous border. Deadhead to prolong flowering. May cause discomfort if eaten. Contact with foliage may aggravate skin allergies.

**Helenium 'Sahin's Early Flowerer'**

Wonderful small to medium perennial grown for its masses of red and orange flowers borne from June to October above green leaves. Ideal for a sunny mixed or herbaceous border. The flowers are attractive to bees. May cause discomfort if eaten, can aggravate skin allergies. Dead-head to prolong flowering.

**Helenium 'Waltraut'**

Delightful small to medium perennial grown for its daisy-shaped bronze-orange flowers with disc-shaped centres, borne late summer/autumn. Colour deepens as flowers mature. Prefers sunny well-drained site, attracts bees and butterflies. May cause discomfort if eaten, contact with foliage may aggravate skin allergies. Deadhead to prolong flowering.

**Helenium autumnale Helena Series 'Helena Red'**

Medium-sized perennial, grown for its profusion of small daisy-like bright red flowers with yellow edges borne from August to September. Ideal for a sunny mixed or herbaceous border. Very attractive to bees. May cause discomfort if eaten, leaves might aggravate skin allergies.

**Helleborus argutifolius (Corsican Hellebore)**

Small to medium evergreen perennial with leathery dark green leaves grown for its profusion of bowl-shaped pale green flowers, in late winter and early spring. Ideal plant for dry wooded areas. Harmful if eaten/skin irritant.

**Helleborus foetidus (Stinking Hellebore or Bear's Foot)**

Small evergreen perennial with coarsely-toothed dark green leaves and pretty light green bell-shaped flowers, from January to April. Ideal plant for dry wooded areas. Harmful if eaten/can cause skin irritation.

**Helleborus niger (Christmas Rose)**

Small evergreen perennial with dark green leaves, grown for its beautiful white saucer-shaped flowers, sometimes pink-flushed, which are borne on purple stems from early winter to early spring. Ideal for a mixed border or woodland garden in dappled shade. Harmful if eaten, skin irritant.

**Helleborus orientalis (Lenten Rose)**

Small evergreen perennial with deep green leaves. From mid-winter to mid-spring it bears wonderful saucer-shaped white or greenish-cream flowers becoming pinker with age. Ideal plant for dry wooded areas. Harmful if eaten/can cause skin irritation.

**Helleborus orientalis 'Double Queen mixed' (Lenten Rose)**

Small perennial with deep green leaves grown for its profusion of spotted dark red, pink and white saucer-shaped flowers from midwinter to mid-spring. Ideal for a mixed or shrub border or woodland garden

**Helleborus orientalis Red Shades (Lenten Rose)**

Small evergreen or semi-evergreen perennial with deep green leaves, grown for its beautiful large saucer-shaped flowers in shades of red, sometimes marked or spotted with other colours, borne from winter to spring. Ideal for a mixed or shrub border or wooded area, provides good ground cover. All parts are harmful if eaten, can irritate skin.

**Helleborus x hybridus 'White Lady' (Lady Series)**

Small to medium clump-forming perennial with dark green leaves, grown for its beautiful large saucer-shaped white flowers borne from winter to spring. Ideal for a mixed or shrub border or wooded area. Provides good ground cover. All parts are harmful if eaten, can irritate skin.

**Hemerocallis 'Chicago Apache'**

Small evergreen perennial with masses of long strap-shaped green leaves, grown for its profusion of glorious large circular velvety rich scarlet flowers with ruffled deeper red margins and white midribs, borne in late summer. Ideal for a herbaceous border, wild garden or container. Divide in spring.

**Hemerocallis 'Contessa'**

Small compact evergreen perennial with strap-shaped green leaves, grown for its abundance of small deep orange flowers borne over a long period from June to August. Ideal for a sunny site in a herbaceous border, wild garden or container. Divide in spring.

**Hemerocallis 'Green Flutter'**

Small to medium evergreen perennial with narrow green strap-shaped leaves, grown for its longer-lasting triangular to star-shaped light yellow flowers with green throats which open late in the afternoon and last throughout the night, borne in midsummer. Ideal for a herbaceous border, wild garden or container. Divide in spring.

**Hemerocallis 'Little Deeke'**

Small evergreen perennial with strap-shaped green leaves, grown for its lovely large circular orange-gold flowers with green throats and ruffled edges, borne in early summer. Ideal for a herbaceous border, wild garden or container. Divide in spring.

**Hemerocallis 'Melvyn'**

Small to medium clump-forming perennial with long narrow strap-shaped mid-green leaves, grown for its profusion of creamy-yellow flowerheads with yellow throats borne in profusion from midsummer to early autumn on tall flower stalks. Ideal for a herbaceous border. Cut back after flowering. Attractive to butterflies.

**Hemerocallis 'Mrs Hugh Johnson' (Day Lily)**

Small to medium evergreen perennial with strap-shaped dark green leaves, grown for its profusion of rich mahogany-red flowerheads on tall stems borne from June to August and flowering repeatedly. Ideal for a border. Cut back after flowering.

**Hemerocallis 'Stella de Oro' (Day Lily)**

Small evergreen perennial with strap-shaped dark green leaves. Grown for its profusion of bright yellow flowerheads on tall stems from early summer, usually flowering repeatedly throughout the summer. Ideal for a mixed herbaceous border. Cut back after flowering.

**Hesperis matronalis Violet (Sweet Rocket or Dame's Violet)**

Small to medium upright perennial grown for its long spikes of violet flowers borne in late spring and summer which have a strong fragrance in the evenings. Ideal for borders or wild gardening. Prefers a sunny well drained site

**Heuchera 'Amethyst Myst'**

Small semi-evergreen clump-forming perennial grown for its silver/burgundy foliage, which beautifully sets off the tiny star-shaped white flowers borne in early summer. Good for ground cover or a mixed border, producing more vivid colour in sun.

**Heuchera 'Berry Smoothie'**

Small semi-evergreen clump-forming perennial grown for its large rose-pink leaves in spring which darken to purple-rose. Bears spikes of tiny star-shaped flowers in spring and summer. An excellent foliage plant for ground cover, a container, bed or border in a sunny sheltered site.

**Heuchera 'Caramel'**

Small robust clump-forming evergreen perennial grown for its attractive honey-apricot leaves with red sides borne throughout the year, setting off the star shaped white flowers borne on slender stems in late summer. Ideal for ground cover or a mixed border. Attractive to bees.

**Heuchera 'Crème Brûlée'**

Small semi-evergreen clump-forming perennial, grown for its stunning orange-bronze foliage setting off masses of tiny star-shaped pale flowers in early summer. Excellent foliage plant for ground cover or a mixed border, tolerant of most conditions. Attractive to bees.

**Heuchera 'Lime Rickey'**

Small evergreen herbaceous perennial grown for its brightly coloured lime-green ruffled foliage, glowing yellow in spring. In spring and summer it produces stems of tiny white star-shaped flowers. It creates a fantastic colour contrast with dark-leaved plants. Best grown in full sun for better colour.

**Heuchera 'Marmalade'**

Small semi-evergreen clump-forming perennial grown for its amber to peachy bronze foliage with pink undersides, which set off the stems of small star-shaped reddish-bronze flowers in early summer. Excellent for ground cover or a border. Will produce more vivid colour in full sun.

**Heuchera 'Midnight Bayou'**

Small semi-evergreen mounded clump-forming perennial, grown for its attractive dark-veined reddish-purple leaves turning darker purple with age. Bears clusters of small bell-shaped pink to cream flowers on tall reddish-purple stems in late spring and summer, which are attractive to bees. Ideal for containers, front of borders, or planted in drifts as ground cover.

**Heuchera 'Midnight Rose'**

Small semi-evergreen clump-forming perennial grown for its dark foliage flecked with rose-pink tints, which brighten to cream throughout the season. Bears tiny star-shaped pale flowers from April to July. Ideal for a container, bed or border in a sunny sheltered site.

**Heuchera 'Obsidian'**

Popular small evergreen herbaceous perennial grown for its stunning shiny deep rich purple-black foliage, which holds its colour well, especially in a sunny site. In spring and summer it produces tall stems of bell-shaped creamy flowers. Produces excellent contrast with other perennials for ground cover or mixed border.

**Heuchera 'Peach Flambe'**

Small semi-evergreen clump-forming perennial, grown for its stunning bright peach coloured foliage, turning plum coloured during the winter. Excellent foliage plant for ground cover or a mixed border, tolerant of most conditions. Attractive to bees.

**Heuchera 'Sashay'**

Small semi-evergreen clump-forming perennial grown for its rich green deeply ruffled foliage with visible burgundy undersides. This is an ideal foliage plant for ground cover or mixed border.



### **Heuchera sanguinea 'Ruby Bells'**

Small clump-forming semi-evergreen perennial grown for its very small, intensely deep red, bell-shaped flowers which are borne over a long period in spring and summer on a myriad of flower spikes contrasting with the green leaves. It has an attractive compact habit and flowers abundantly. Ideal for ground cover or a mixed border.

### **Heuchera villosa 'Palace Purple' (Coral Flower)**

Small semi-evergreen clump-forming perennial grown for its striking plum-purple leaves with a metallic sheen setting off the masses of tiny star-shaped white flowers. Excellent foliage plant for ground cover or mixed border.

### **x Heucherella 'Stoplight'**

Small evergreen clump-forming perennial grown for its stunning foliage. The heart-shaped leaves are bright yellow with red centres in spring, and vary from straw yellow to green with a red centre. White flowers are produced in spring. Ideal for a container or border for eye-catching spring colour.

### **x Heucherella 'Tapestry'**

Small evergreen herbaceous perennial grown for its stunning bottle-green to blue foliage with purple veining, which becomes green with a dark centre in autumn and winter. In spring and summer it produces stems of warm pink star-shaped flowers. Excellent for ground cover or a mixed border. Colours better in full sun.

### **Holcus mollis 'White Fog' (v)**

Dwarf clump-forming evergreen variegated grass with long thin spidery green leaves that have a central strip of white. A very hardy grass that is good for ground cover. Can be cut back hard after flowering to keep tidy.

### **Hosta:**

A selection of these attractive small perennials are available.

### **Houttuynia cordata 'Chameleon' (v)**

Small spreading deciduous perennial grown for its decorative leaves which are variegated bright green, yellow and red and smell of oranges when crushed. It bears small white star-shaped flowers in summer. Thrives in damp conditions. Leaf colour is enhanced by sun.

### **Humulus lupulus 'Aureus' (Golden Hop)**

Large vigorous twining deciduous perennial grown for its attractive golden yellow foliage. Ideal for fences, pergolas, trellises and small trees. Grow in sunny position for best leaf colour. Cut down in late autumn.

### **Hydrangea anomala subsp petiolaris (climbing Hydrangea - Lacecap)**

Large slow-growing deciduous self-clinging climber with attractive heart-shaped leaves which turn yellow in autumn. Flat heads of small white flowers are produced in June. Will grow in sun or shade, including a north facing wall.

**Hydrangea macrophylla 'Blue Bonnet' (Hortensia)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its spectacular large blue to pink mophead flowers produced throughout the summer. Colour can vary according to soil conditions.

**Hydrangea macrophylla 'Générale Vicomtesse de Vibraye'**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its spectacular large clear blue to pink mophead flowers produced throughout the summer. Colour can vary according to soil conditions.

**Hydrangea macrophylla 'Mariesii Perfecta' (Lacecap)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its spectacular large rich blue, lilac or pink flowers produced throughout the summer. Colour can vary according to soil conditions.

**Hydrangea paniculata 'Tardiva'**

Large deciduous shrub grown for its massive, very showy, white and pinkish-white flowerheads throughout the autumn - a useful later-flowering variety. To obtain larger flowerheads, cut back previous season's shoots hard in spring.

**Hydrangea seemannii**

Unusual large slow-growing evergreen self-clinging climber with long glossy green leaves and clusters of white flowers in summer. Prefers a sheltered south-facing wall.

**Hydrangea serrata 'Kiyosumi'**

Small to medium deciduous shrub grown for its white lacecap flowers with pink edges which open from red buds, from midsummer to early autumn. The new foliage is rich maroon-red. Prefers semi-shade. Can cause mild stomach upset if ingested. Contact with foliage can aggravate skin allergies.

**Hypericum 'Hidcote'**

Medium-sized semi-evergreen shrub grown for its abundant golden-yellow cup-shaped flowers, from summer to early autumn. A good reliable shrub for most conditions.

**Hypericum olympicum f. minus 'Sulphureum'**

Small deciduous shrub with tiny grey-green leaves and striking lemon-yellow flowers in summer. Ideal for a sunny site at the front of a low border.

**Ilex x altaclerensis 'Golden King' (f/v)**

Large evergreen shrub or small tree grown for its attractively-variegated gold and green leaves. This is a female variety which will produce red berries in autumn if pollinated by a male variety. Good for hedges and topiary. Can be pruned to size or shape. Berries may cause mild stomach upset if ingested.

**Ilex aquifolium (Common or English holly)**

Large evergreen shrub or small tree which can be pruned to size. Its familiar spiny dark green leaves complement the Christmassy red berries beautifully. Ideal for hedging or topiary.

**Ilex aquifolium 'Argentea Marginata' (f/v)**

A large columnar female tree with cream-streaked green stems and oval spiny dark green leaves with wide creamy-white margins, shrimp-pink when young. Bears abundant, very bright red berries.

**Ilex aquifolium 'Elegantissima' (m/v) (5 litre)**

Large evergreen shrub or small tree which can be pruned to size. Its familiar spiny dark green leaves complement the Christmassy red berries beautifully. Ideal for hedging or topiary.

**Ilex aquifolium 'Handsworth New Silver' (f/v) (5 litre)**

Large dense columnar evergreen shrub or small tree, with dark purple stems bearing long mid-green spiny leaves with creamy margins. Produces bright red berries in autumn if there is a male holly nearby. Ideal for a specimen tree. Good for coastal areas.

**Ilex aquifolium 'Silver Milkmaid' (f/v)**

Medium-sized evergreen tree grown for its spiny dark green leaves with large irregular white central blotches, and red berries from late autumn. Ideal for a well-drained sunny position. Makes an excellent specimen or hedging plant. Berries may cause mild stomach upset if ingested.

**Ilex aquifolium 'Silver Queen' (m/v)**

Medium to large dense upright slow-growing male tree with purple stems and oval spiny very dark green leaves with broad cream margins. Pink when young.

**Imperata cylindrical 'Rubra' (Red Baron)**

Small slow-spreading perennial grass, forming clumps of mid-green leaves which quickly turn a striking deep blood-red from the tips almost to the base. Spikes of fluffy silvery-white flowerheads are borne in late summer. Ideal for the front of a mixed or herbaceous border in a sunny position, or for containers.

**Inula hookeri**

Small deciduous clump-forming perennial grown for its profusion of attractive yellow daisy-like flowerheads from late summer to mid-autumn. Thrives in sun or part shade in any reasonable soil. Ideal cottage garden plant.

**Inula magnifica**

Large clump-forming perennial with purple-streaked hairy stems and long dark green leaves, grown for its very large bright golden yellow flat daisy-like flowerheads borne from late summer to mid-autumn. Ideal for a wild garden. Prefers a sunny site.

**Iris japonica 'Variegata' (v)**

Small perennial with evergreen glossy white and green striped foliage. Produces stunning white/lavender blue flowers in late spring. Grown in full sun or partial shade. Harmful if eaten.

**Jasminum polyanthum (climber)**

Medium-sized deciduous twining climber with deep green leaves. Grown for its highly fragrant white flowers which open from clusters of pink buds and bloom from May to August. This strong-growing plant is one of the best jasmines. Ideal for a trellis or pergola in full sun or part shade.

**Jasminum nudiflorum (Winter Jasmine)**

Medium-sized deciduous arching winter-flowering shrub with small dark green leaves. Bright yellow flowers appear on the naked branches from late autumn to early spring. Good wall or trellis shrub, needing support.

**Jasminium officinale**

Large deciduous twining climber with attractive green leaves and clusters of deliciously fragrant white flowers from early summer to early autumn. Ideal for trellises and pergolas.

**Jasminum officinale (Poets' Jasmine)**

Large deciduous twining climber with attractive green leaves and clusters of deliciously fragrant white flowers from early summer to early autumn. Ideal for trellises and pergolas. Prefers a sunny sheltered site.

**Jasminum officinale 'Aureum'**

Large strong-growing deciduous climber with attractive green leaves, variegated and suffused with yellow and deliciously fragrant free-flowering white scented flowers in clusters from early summer to early autumn.

**Jasminum officinale 'Fiona Sunrise'**

Large deciduous twining climber with unusual attractive bright yellow leaves and deliciously fragrant white flowers from early summer to early autumn. Ideal for trellises and pergolas. Less vigorous and more tender than the green-leaved jasmine.

**Juniperus scopulorum 'Skyrocket'**

Tall narrow coniferous tree grown for its architectural shape and attractive blue-grey foliage. It is one of the narrowest of all conifers, ideal for breaking up low planting schemes.

**Juniperus squamata 'Blue Star'**

Dwarf neat evergreen conifer grown for its delightful silvery-blue foliage. Ideal for rockeries and colourful borders.

**Kerria japonica 'Pleniflora' (Jew's Mallow)**

Vigorous medium-sized deciduous shrub with bright green leaves and pompom-like double golden yellow flowers in mid to late spring. Cut back flowering shoots in June.

**Kniphofia 'Dorset Sentry' (Red-hot poker)**

Attractive medium-sized clump-forming deciduous perennial with long narrow grass-like leaves. It is grown for the bold spikes bearing fat pokers of bright yellow flowers, opening from the bottom up from July to October, which are very attractive to bees. Prefers a sunny sheltered well-drained site. Ideal for giving a cottage garden effect to a border.

**Kniphofia 'Flamenco' (Red-hot poker)**

Medium-sized perennial grown for its big bold spikes of striking orange and yellow flowers from mid-summer to early autumn which are very attractive to bees. Ideal in a border for that cottage garden effect. Prefers a sunny site.

**Kniphofia caulescens (Red-hot poker)**

Medium-sized evergreen perennial with striking blue-green sword-like foliage. Grown for its dense heads of coral red and yellow flowerheads borne on thick stems in summer and autumn. Ideal for a sunny border, giving a cottage garden effect.

**Laurus nobilis (Bay Tree, Sweet Bay)**

Large evergreen shrub or medium tree with glossy dark highly aromatic green leaves often used in cooking. Ideal seaside plant. Good in a large pot. Can be trimmed to form a pyramid. Popular plant for that Mediterranean courtyard look.

**Lavandula 'Fathead'**

Attractive small evergreen shrub with highly aromatic grey-green foliage and large round plum-purple tufted flowerheads throughout the summer. This is a particularly strong variety which usually survives the winter very well. A compact variety ideal for the front of a sunny border.

**Lavandula angustifolia**

Lovely small compact bushy evergreen shrub with narrow grey-green leaves, grown for its beautiful dense spikes of fragrant pale to deep purple flowers in mid and late summer. Ideal for a sunny border or pot.

**Lavandula angustifolia 'Alba'**

Small evergreen shrub with highly aromatic narrow grey-green leaves and attractive very fragrant white flowers produced on fairly long stems throughout the summer. Prune in early spring to keep a good shape. Prefers a sunny site.

**Lavandula angustifolia 'Dwarf Blue'**

Lovely dwarf compact evergreen shrub, grown for its aromatic silvery-grey leaves and dense spikes of fragrant blue flowers throughout the summer. Ideal for edging, for a border, rockery or herb garden.

**Lavandula angustifolia 'Hidcote' (English Lavender)**

Small compact evergreen shrub with highly aromatic silvery-grey foliage which provides a beautiful contrast to the fragrant deep purple-blue flowers which are borne throughout the summer. Ideal for low hedges. Prefers a sunny site. Prune in early spring to keep good shape.

**Lavandula angustifolia 'Imperial Gem'**

Small neat compact evergreen shrub grown for its masses of highly fragrant rich purple flowers borne throughout the summer, which contrast beautifully with the silvery-grey foliage, and are highly attractive to bees and beneficial insects. This variety is a more reliable alternative to 'Hidcote'.

**Lavandula angustifolia 'Rosea'**

Dwarf compact evergreen shrub with highly aromatic grey-green foliage and fragrant clear pink flowers throughout the summer. Ideal for low hedges. Prefers a sunny site. Prune in early spring to keep good shape.

**Lavandula viridis**

Small evergreen shrub with highly aromatic narrow green leaves and unusual fragrant yellow-green flowerheads throughout the summer. Ideal for a sheltered sunny site. Slightly more tender than English lavender. Prune in early spring to keep good shape.

**Lavatera x clementii 'Barnsley' (Mallow)**

Medium to large semi-evergreen shrub, grown for its abundant hollyhock-like very pale pink flowers which have a red eye and appear over a very long period throughout summer and autumn. Ideal for the back of a sunny border to create that cottage garden look. Can be cut back hard in late spring if necessary.

**Lavatera x clementii 'Burgundy Wine' (Mallow)**

Medium to large evergreen shrub grown for its abundant hollyhock-like deep pink flowers which appear over a very long period throughout summer and autumn. Ideal for the back of a sunny border to create that cottage garden look. Can be cut back hard in late spring if necessary.

### **Lavatera thuringiaca 'Red Rum' (Tree Mallow)**

New medium-sized compact variety of this deciduous or semi-evergreen shrub, grown for its abundant reddish-pink hollyhock-like flowers on dark stems over a long period during summer and autumn. It is ideal for sunny borders in small gardens for that cottage garden look, can also be grown in a container. Prefers sunny well-drained site.

### **Leptospermum liversidgei**

Medium to large evergreen shrub with grey-green leaves, lemon-scented when crushed, and graceful sprays of small white flowers in late spring and summer. Prefers a sheltered sunny site.

### **Leptospermum scoparium 'Red Damask' (New Zealand Tea Tree)**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub with narrow aromatic dark reddish-green leaves which set off sprays of long-lasting double deep-red flowers like tiny roses in late spring and summer. Prefers a sheltered sunny site.

### **Leucanthemum x superbum 'Aglaia'**

Small clump-forming perennial with glossy dark green leaves, grown for its attractive fringed semi-double white flowerheads with pale yellow centres, which are borne from early summer to early autumn. Good for a herbaceous border and for cut flowers.

### **Leucanthemum x superbum 'Banana Cream'**

Medium-sized clump-forming perennial with dark green foliage grown for its attractive daisy-like flowers with lemon-yellow petals which turn a soft butter yellow and then ivory, surrounding a yellow button eye, and are borne profusely from early summer to autumn. Ideal for a sunny border.

### **Leucanthemum x superbum 'Crazy Daisy'**

Medium-sized clump-forming perennial with dark green leaves grown for its attractive double white daisy-like flowers with a yellow eye, borne profusely throughout June and July. Ideal for a herbaceous border.

### **Leucanthemum x superbum 'Goldrausch'**

Small to medium compact perennial, grown for its huge cream double daisy-like ruffled flowerheads with yellow centres on tall upright stems, borne from early summer to early autumn. Ideal plant for a sunny border.

### **Leucanthemum x superbum 'Snow Lady' (Shasta daisy)**

Small compact perennial, grown for its masses of single white daisy-like flowers with bright yellow centres borne throughout the summer. Ideal for a herbaceous bed or border in sun or partial shade.

### **Leucanthemum x superbum 'Snowcap'**

Small chrysanthemum-like clump-forming perennial with dark green leaves, grown for its profusion of single white flowerheads with pale yellow centres, borne from early summer to early autumn. Useful in a herbaceous border or for cut flowers, this is a dwarf variety of the plant. Mulch in May and cut down to ground level in autumn.

**Leycesteria formosa (Himalayan Honeysuckle)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub whose blue-green cane-like stems bear slender oval dark green leaves. In summer and early autumn highly decorative white flowers with unusual purple-red bracts hang gracefully from the arching branches giving an oriental feel. These are followed in late autumn by attractive red-purple berries.

**Liatris spicata (Gayfeather)**

Attractive perennial growing to a height of 2 feet, grown for its tall spikes of fluffy, pale purple flowers in mid to late summer which open from the top downwards. These are complemented by the glossy deep green foliage. Ideal for the front of a herbaceous or mixed border. They make excellent cut flowers and are very attractive to butterflies. Dies down for the winter.

**Libertia grandiflora**

Unlike most perennials which die down in the winter, this small plant keeps its sword-like evergreen leaves throughout the year. Delightful sprays of white flowers are produced on flower stalks above the leaves in early to mid-summer. Prefers a well-drained sunny site. Ideal for a mixed border or gravel garden.

**Ligustrum ovalifolium (Privet)**

Medium to large dense semi-evergreen shrub with dark-green leaves. The white flowers are followed by black fruits. Can be trimmed to form a neat hedge and is tolerant of most conditions. Harmful if eaten.

**Limonium latifolium (Sea lavender)**

Small perennial with large leathery dark green leaves, grown for its profuse clusters of attractive lavender-blue flowers in late summer. The flowers are often dried for indoor decoration. Prefers a sunny site.

**Liriope muscari (Lilyturf)**

Small grass-like evergreen spreading perennial with long narrow glossy dark green leaves. It is grown for its attractive spikes of lavender or purple-blue flowers in autumn.

**Liriope muscari 'Amethyst'**

Small evergreen perennial forming clumps of strap-shaped glossy dark green grass-like foliage, grown for its beautiful deep purple flowers resembling small grapes in March and April. A stunning new variety, ideal for the front of a border, ground cover or mixed container. Prefers a sunny sheltered site.

**Liriope muscari 'Big Blue'**

Small evergreen perennial with long narrow strap-shaped glossy dark green leaves, grown for its dense spikes of big bright violet-blue flowers on purple-green stems in autumn. Ideal for a border or as ground cover in partial or full shade. Prefers a sheltered site.

**Liriope muscari 'Ingwersen'**

Small evergreen clump-forming perennial, with long narrow dark green leaves, grown for its attractive spikes of blue-purple flowers in late summer and autumn, followed by black fruits. Ideal for a border or as ground cover in full or part shade. This variety flowers earlier than most liriopes.

**Liriope muscari 'Variegata' (Lilyturf)**

Small grass-like evergreen spreading perennial grown for its long narrow glossy green and cream variegated leaves which contrast well with its attractive spikes of purple-blue flowers in autumn. Thrives in sun or partial shade. Ideal for ground cover or for edging a herbaceous border. Lift and divide in spring.

**Lobelia cardinalis 'Queen Victoria'**

Small to medium clump-forming perennial with upright stems and attractive red-purple leaves. Striking scarlet flowers are produced in late summer. Very effective plant for waterside planting and mixed borders. May need protection from slugs. Cut back flower stalks after flowering. Harmful if eaten.

**Lobelia x speciosa 'Fan Blue'**

Small to medium clump-forming perennial, grown for its very attractive dense blue flower spikes on deep green foliage borne throughout the summer, bringing colour to the garden. Ideal for a herbaceous border or for planting with bedding. Likes a moist sunny site. Harmful if eaten.

**Lobelia x speciosa 'Fan Scarlet'**

Small to medium clump-forming perennial with copper-coloured leaves, grown for its attractive spikes of deep red flowers borne throughout the summer, bringing a colourful touch to the garden. Likes a moist sunny site. Harmful if eaten.

**Lobelia splendens (Scarlet Lobelia)**

Small to medium clump-forming perennial with purple-green leaves and stunning tubular scarlet flowers in late summer. May need protection from slugs. Harmful if eaten.

**Lonicera x brownii 'Dropmore Scarlet' (Scarlet Trumpet Honeysuckle)**

Large deciduous twining climber with striking clusters of slightly fragrant bright scarlet tubular flowers with orange throats from July to October. Ideal for trellises, pergolas, sheds and trees.

**Lonicera x heckrottii 'Gold Flame'**

Large deciduous twining climber grown for its numerous clusters of bright orange and pink flowers produced over a very long period in summer. Ideal for trellises, pergolas and archways.

**Lonicera japonica 'Hall's Prolific'**

Large vigorous semi-evergreen twining climber with light green leaves, grown for its profuse abundance of highly fragrant white flowers which turn yellow and are borne throughout summer and autumn. Ideal for a wall or fence, growing over a tree or shed. The blue-black berries may cause mild stomach upset if ingested.

**Lonicera nitida 'Baggesen's Gold'**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub grown for its bright golden foliage. Makes a delightful dense shrub which can be trimmed to make an excellent hedge or for topiary.

**Lonicera nitida 'Lemon Beauty' (v)**

Small evergreen shrub grown for its attractive bright variegated gold and green foliage which looks good all year round. Ideal for ground cover or patio pots.



**Lonicera periclymenum 'Belgica' (Early Dutch Honeysuckle)**

Large vigorous deciduous twining climber grown for its highly scented reddish-purple flowers which appear in spring and often again in late summer. This is one of the traditional cottage garden honeysuckles.

**Lonicera periclymenum 'Purple Queen'**

Large semi-evergreen twining climber with attractive purple-tinged leaves and a profusion of highly fragrant purple and white flowers over a long period from spring to late summer. Ideal for screening.

**Lonicera periclymenum 'Serotina' (Late Dutch Honeysuckle)**

Large vigorous deciduous twining climber grown for its highly-scented purple and pink flowers from July to October. This is one of the traditional cottage garden honeysuckles.

**Lonicera x purpusii 'Winter Beauty'**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its highly-scented small white flowers which appear in clusters on bare stems from December to April. Provides winter interest in the garden.

**Lonicera similis var. delavayi**

Large evergreen twining climber with showy, highly fragrant, creamy yellow flowers in summer. This variety is in constant demand, as evergreen flowering climbers are hard to find. Ideal for a wall or fence, an archway, or a trellis.

**Lotus hirsutus (Hairy Canary Clover)**

Charming small spreading semi-evergreen shrub with small grey-green hairy leaves and clusters of delightful pink and white pea-like flowers in summer and early autumn. Ideal for dry sunny borders. Can be pruned hard in late spring to keep tidy.

**Luma apiculata 'Glanleam Gold' (v) (Myrtus)**

Medium-sized slow-growing evergreen shrub with small brightly variegated green and cream leaves. The upright stems are bedecked with small fluffy fragrant white flowers in late summer and autumn followed by red fruits ripening to purple. Has peeling bark. Prefers a sheltered site.

**Lupinus 'The Page'**

Popular clump-forming perennial grown for its attractive tall spikes of rich carmine-red flowers borne in early and mid summer. Ideal for a border or wild garden in well-drained soil. The seeds may cause severe discomfort if ingested.

**Lupinus 'Desert Sun'**

Popular medium-sized clump-forming perennial grown for its attractive foliage and tall spikes of rich custard-yellow flowers in June and July. Prefers a sunny site. Harmful if eaten.

**Lupinus 'Manhattan Lights'**

Popular medium-sized clump-forming perennial, grown for its attractive tall spikes of golden yellow flowers with mauve edges, borne in summer. Thrives in sun or light shade in any well-drained soil. Ideal for a border. Harmful if eaten.

**Lupinus 'Persian Slipper'**

Popular medium-sized clump-forming perennial, grown for its attractive tall spikes of mauve-purple flowers with mauve edges, borne in summer. Thrives in sun or light shade in any well-drained soil. Ideal for a border. Harmful if eaten.

**Lupinus 'Red Flame' (syn. 'Rote Flamme')**

Popular clump-forming deciduous perennial grown for its stunning tall spikes of brilliant carmine-red flowers with flashes of yellow, borne from May to August. Ideal for a border or wild garden in a sunny well-drained site to give a cottage garden feel. Attractive to bees, butterflies and birds. Seeds may cause severe discomfort if ingested.

**Lupinus 'Red Rum'**

Medium-sized clump-forming perennial, grown for its stunning tall spikes of blood-red flowers borne throughout the summer. Ideal for a border in sun or light shade in any well-drained soil. Harmful if eaten.

**Lupinus 'Salmon Star'**

Popular medium-sized clump-forming perennial, grown for its attractive tall spikes of salmon orange-pink flowers with mauve edges, borne in summer. Thrives in sun or light shade in any well-drained soil. Ideal for a border. Harmful if eaten.

**Lupinus 'The Chatelaine'**

Popular medium-sized perennial grown for its attractive tall spikes of bright pink and white flowers borne in late spring and early summer above compact mounds of bright green deeply fingered foliage. Ideal for a sunny border or to give a cottage garden effect. Harmful if eaten.

**Lupinus 'The Governor'**

Attractive small clump-forming perennial, grown for its spikes of deep blue and white flowers which are borne from early to mid summer. Prefers well-drained soil in full sun or partial shade. Harmful if eaten.

**Lychnis chalcedonica (Jerusalem cross) (Campion)**

Medium-sized clump-forming perennial grown for its large heads of bright red flowers borne on long upright leafy stems. Prefers a sunny site. Ideal for cottage garden or mixed border.

**Lychnis coronaria (Rose campion, Dusty miller)**

Medium-sized biennial or perennial with woolly silver-grey leaves, grown for its long succession of purple-red or pale purple flowers on long stalks which are borne throughout the summer and are attractive to butterflies. Prefers a dry sunny site. Ideal for a border or wild garden. Deadhead to prolong flowering.

**Lychnis coronaria 'Alba (White Champion)**

Small to medium perennial, grown for its large woolly silver-grey leaves which contrast beautifully with the long succession of pure white flowers. Ideal for a sunny border or wild garden, where they will spread easily. Prefers a dry sunny site. Deadhead to prolong flowering.

**Lychnis flos-cuculi 'Jenny' (Ragged Robin)**

Small to medium upright slender perennial grown for its beautiful large fluffy double pink flowers borne from early summer to early autumn. Easy to grow, and ideal for a sunny border or wild garden. Cut back hard to encourage reblooming.

**Lysimachia atropurpurea 'Beaujolaie'**

Striking small to medium perennial with attractive crinkled silver-green foliage, which sets off beautifully the wonderful purple to wine-red flowerheads, which are borne throughout the summer and are highly attractive to butterflies. Ideal for a moist border or poolside in sun or part shade, or as a patio plant.

**Lysimachia ciliata 'Firecracker'**

Stunning small clump-forming perennial grown for its large heads of bright red flowers borne on long upright leafy stems. Prefers a sunny site. Ideal for cottage garden or mixed border.

**Lysimachia clethroides**

Small to medium perennial grown for its showy spikes of small white flowers in late summer. Prefers moist soil in sun or partial shade.

**Lysimachia punctata 'Alexander' (v)**

Small perennial grown for its variegated green and white leaves, pink when young, and masses of cup-shaped yellow flowers in mid and late summer. Good, partial spreading ground cover in sun or shade.

**Lysimachia punctata 'Golden Alexander' (syn. 'Walgoldalex')**

Medium-sized perennial grown for its variegated green and white leaves, pink when young, and masses of cup-shaped yellow flowers in mid and late summer. This plant is tolerant of a wide range of conditions and is ideal for a border or container.

**Lythrum salicaria 'Blush'**

Medium-sized clump-forming perennial, grown for its showy blush-pink flower spikes, which are produced on upright stems from mid-summer to early autumn. Ideal for a herbaceous border to give a cottage garden look. Will tolerate damp conditions. Cut back last year's dead stems hard in late autumn or early spring.

**Lythrum salicaria 'Robert' (Purple Loosestrife)**

Medium-sized clump-forming perennial, grown for its showy bright pink flower spikes which are produced on upright stems from mid-summer to early autumn. Ideal for use in a herbaceous border to give a cottage garden look. Will tolerate damp conditions. Cut back last year's dead stems hard in late autumn or early spring.

**Magnolia 'Susan'**

Large upright deciduous shrub or tree with large mid-green leaves, grown for its large fragrant goblet-shaped purple-red flowers with paler insides produced in spring from slender dark red-purple buds. Grows best in a sheltered site, as a specimen or among other shrubs and trees. Mulch in early spring.

**Magnolia x soulangeana**

Large deciduous shrub or tree with large dark green leaves grown for its stunning very large goblet-shaped white flowers with rose-pink bases, borne in mid to late spring before and with the young leaves. Prefers acid soil in a sunny sheltered site. Mulch in early spring.

**Magnolia stellata (Star magnolia)**

Large compact deciduous shrub grown for its delightful profusion of perfumed large white pink-tinged flowers borne in early to mid-spring before the leaves. Ideal magnolia if space is limited. Prefers a sunny or lightly shaded site in acid to neutral soil.

**Mahonia japonica**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub with large spiny green leaves on upright branches. It is grown for its showy long arching sprays of lemon yellow highly-scented flowers which are produced from late autumn to early spring followed by blue-purple berries.

**Mahonia x media 'Charity'**

Medium to large evergreen shrub with large spiny dark green leaves on upright branches. It is grown for its superb long arching sprays of fragrant deep yellow flowers from late autumn to late winter. A dramatic architectural plant for a large garden.

**Matteuccia struthiopteris 'Ostrich' or Shuttlecock fern**

Large deciduous fern grown for its attractive shuttlecock of pale green fronds. Shorter dark brown fronds appear in mid or late summer and persist through the winter. Ideal for moist shade or a woodland garden, damp border or pond side.

**Melianthus major (Honeybush)**

Medium to large shrub grown for its very attractive, toothed blue-green leaves and tall spikes of deep brick-red to crimson flowers borne from late spring to midsummer. Prefers a sheltered sunny site. Ideal for a border or specimen plant especially in coastal areas. Can die down in winter in cold areas. Will usually re-sprout annually from the base.

**Milium effusum 'Aureum' (Golden Wood Millet)**

Small slow-spreading semi-evergreen perennial grass with bright golden-yellow leaves. Tiny golden delicate nodding flower spikelets are produced from spring to mid summer.

**Miscanthus oligostachyus**

Medium to large clump-forming deciduous perennial grass with green leaves, grown for its dense clumps of narrow silvery spikes of flowerheads in late summer and autumn. Turns an attractive bronze-red in autumn. Cut back in spring.

**Miscanthus sinensis 'Early Hybrid'**

Medium-sized deciduous clump-forming perennial grass with long flat narrow green leaves, grown for its stunning large silky pale-grey to purple-brown flowerheads in late summer. A wonderful architectural focal point, ideal as a free-standing specimen, in a mixed or herbaceous border, or for poolside planting. Prefers a sunny site. Cut to the ground in early spring.

**Miscanthus sinensis 'Ferner Osten'**

Medium-sized deciduous perennial grass grown for its tall slender green leaves and long deep purple feathery flowerheads, borne above the leaves from July onwards. Flowers earlier than most Miscanthus varieties and makes a stunning architectural focal point. Prefers a sunny well-drained site. Cut back dead leaves in spring.

**Miscanthus sinensis 'Gold Bar' (v)**

Small clump-forming perennial grass grown for its striking and sparkling reed-like green foliage with broad horizontal creamy-yellow bands borne throughout the season. Ideal architectural focal point, but much smaller than the other miscanthus - it quickly forms a clump. Cut back hard in spring

**Miscanthus sinensis 'Morning Light'**

Beautiful deciduous clump-forming perennial grass with long tall slender green leaves with white borders, giving a silvery effect. It bears tall heads of pale crimson flower plumes, which fade to reddish bronze, from late summer to late autumn. A wonderful architectural focal point. Prefers a sunny well-drained site. Cut back dead foliage in spring.

**Miscanthus sinensis 'Strictus' (v)**

Medium to large perennial grass grown for its striking arching reed-like green foliage with bold gold horizontal stripes. Ideal architectural focal point. Cut back hard in spring.

**Miscanthus sinensis 'Yakushima Dwarf'**

Small perennial grass grown for its striking green foliage with white midribs and its compact size. It bears lovely pinkish-brown flowers in autumn. Ideal for a border or waterside planting.

**Miscanthus sinensis var. condensatus 'Cosmopolitan' (v)**

Large clump-forming perennial grass grown for its boldly variegated green and white reed-like foliage. Creamy spikelets of flowerheads are produced in autumn. Ideal architectural focal point. Cut back hard in spring.

**Molinia caerulea subsp. arundinacea 'Skyracer'**

Tall perennial grass which can reach a height of 7 feet, grown for its attractive graceful clumps of purple spikelets on yellow stems which turn a beautiful clear gold in autumn. Ideal for a mixed border or woodland garden.

**Molinia caerulea subsp. caerulea 'Variegata' (v)**

Small perennial grass with striped creamy foliage and attractive green flowerheads with dark purple tinges borne on bright yellow stems. Ideal for a mixed border or woodland garden.

**Myrtus communis (Common Myrtle)**

Medium evergreen aromatic shrub with dark glossy green leaves and profuse saucer-shaped fragrant fluffy white flowers in mid-spring to late summer, followed by purple-black berries. Good seaside plant in a sunny site.

**Myrtus communis subsp. tarentina**

Medium evergreen shrub with small glossy dark green aromatic leaves and profuse fragrant saucer-shaped fluffy white flowers from mid-spring to early summer, followed by spherical white fruits. It is very wind-resistant and makes a good hedge in a mild area. Prefers a sunny site.

**Nepeta 'Six Hills Giant'**

Small vigorous perennial with hairy, highly aromatic grey-green leaves. Bears abundant, pretty, spike-like lavender-blue flowers for a long period over summer. Grow in any well-drained soil in full sun or partial shade. Attractive to bees.

**Nepeta nervosa 'Blue Moon'**

Small to medium bushy perennial grown for its abundant spikes of dense blue flowers produced over a long period from mid summer to autumn. Ideal for a mixed or herbaceous border. Very attractive to bees.

**Nepeta nervosa 'Pink Cat'**

Medium-sized bushy perennial grown for its abundant spikes of intensely pink flowers. Borne from midsummer to early autumn. Ideal for a mixed or herbaceous border. Attractive to bees.

***Nepeta subsessilis* 'Sweet Dreams' (Catmint)**

Small bushy herbaceous perennial grown for its spikes of showy lilac-pink flowers borne from May to September, and its aromatic grey-green foliage which is very popular with cats. Ideal for a sunny well-drained site, it makes a good ground cover plant. Remove dead heads to prolong flowering, and remove old growth when new shoots appear in spring.

***Nerine bowdenii* (1 litre)**

Delightful small bulbous perennial grown for its lily-like pink flowers which provide striking colour to brighten the garden in autumn. Prefers a sunny well-drained site and flowers best when bulbs are planted close together. Mulch in winter in cold areas. Susceptible to slugs.

***Oenothera* 'Crown Imperial'**

Small attractive perennial with deep green upright stems. Grown for its striking, deep yellow flowers which are produced for a long period over summer. Can be grown in poor to moderately fertile soils. A beautiful plant!

***Oenothera fruticosa* subsp. *glauca* 'Erica Robin' (v)**

Small erect perennial with softly hairy red-tinged stems, grown for its masses of cup-shaped yellow flowers produced for a long period from early spring to late summer. Can be grown in poor to moderately fertile soil in full sun. Can even tolerate stony soil.

***Olea europaea* (Olive tree)**

Slow-growing medium-sized evergreen tree with grey-green leaves. In hot summers tiny fragrant creamy-white flowers may be followed by edible oval olive-green fruit. Grow as a specimen tree in a courtyard garden or sheltered sunny site for a Mediterranean look to your garden. Protect from frosts.

***Olearia x haastii* (Daisy bush)**

Rounded medium-sized evergreen shrub with glossy grey-green leaves. It is covered with heads of fragrant daisy-like white flowers from mid to late summer. Good wind-resistant plant which prefers a sunny site.

***Ophiopogon planiscapus* 'Nigrescens' (Black Dragon)**

Small evergreen clump-forming perennial grown for its unusual, almost black, grass-like leaves. Small bell-shaped purplish-white flowers are produced in summer followed by dark blue-black fruits. Ideal for an alpine garden planted through gravel.

***Osmanthus x burkwoodii***

Medium-sized evergreen shrub whose small glossy dark green leaves set off a profusion of small highly fragrant white flowers from mid to late spring. Prefers a sunny sheltered site.

***Osmanthus heterophyllus* 'Variegatus'**

A medium evergreen slow-growing upright shrub with small holly-like glossy green leaves with white margins. Fragrant clusters of white flowers in autumn. Any well-drained soil in full sun.

**Osmunda regalis (Royal fern)**

Large deciduous native fern with dainty thin fronds which uncurl coppery-brown, becoming a fresh bright green and then turning light green and yellow in autumn. The fertile fronds produce large rusty tassel-like "flowers" in summer. Prefers a moist site in dappled shade.

**Osteospermum 'Lady Leitrim'**

Small low-growing perennial grown for its profusion of large white daisy-like flowers on long stems, which open in the sun and close at night, borne from late spring to autumn. Ideal for the front of a sunny border or wall in a sheltered well-drained site.

**Osteospermum 'Nairobi Purple' (syn. 'Tresco Purple')**

Small mound-forming perennial with green foliage with red-tinted stems, grown for its profusion of large purple daisy-like flowers with distinct veins and paler undersides borne from May to October, which open to greet the sun. Ideal for a dry sunny border or a wall. Forms weed-suppressing ground cover.

**Osteospermum jucundum (African Daisy)**

Small clump-forming perennial grown for its profusion of large soft pink daisy-like flowers which open in the sun and close at night, and are borne from late spring to autumn. Ideal for the front of a sunny border or wall.

**Osteospermum jucundum var. compactum (African daisy)**

Small upright clump-forming perennial grown for its profusion of white daisy-like flowers with dark blue centres which open in the sun and close at night and are borne in summer and autumn. Ideal for the front of a sunny border or wall. Needs a sunny sheltered site.

**Pachysandra terminalis**

Small evergreen creeping perennial with glossy dark green leaves and small white flowers in spring or early summer. Ideal for ground cover in shrub borders or woodland gardens. Will tolerate dry shady conditions.

**Pachysandra terminalis 'Green Carpet'**

Small evergreen creeping perennial with glossy dark green leaves and small white flowers in spring or early summer. Ideal for ground cover in shrub borders or woodland gardens. Will tolerate dry shady conditions.

**Panicum virgatum 'Heavy Metal' (Switch grass)**

Medium-sized upright perennial grass grown for its striking metallic blue-grey leaves borne in stiff upright clumps turning butter yellow in the autumn. The clumps of leaves are set off by huge open heads of purplish flowerheads on light airy stems forming a haze of colour above the foliage. Ideal for a sunny mixed or herbaceous border.

**Parthenocissus henryana (Chinese Virginia Creeper)**

Large self-clinging deciduous tendril climber, grown for its beautiful deep green leaves with conspicuous white or pink veins which turn bright red in autumn. Will grow in any aspect but colours best in partial shade. Ideal for walls or trellises.

**Parthenocissus quinquefolia (Virginia Creeper)**

Large deciduous tendril climber grown for its masses of mid-green leaves which turn a striking brilliant orange, red and crimson in autumn. Ideal for walls or trellises.

**Parthenocissus tricuspidata 'Veitchii' (Boston Ivy)**

Large deciduous self-clinging tendril climber grown for its green leaves which turn a spectacular rich crimson and scarlet in autumn. Makes a solid mass of colourful covering for a wall or building.

**Passiflora caerulea (Blue Passion Flower)**

Large evergreen or semi-evergreen tendril climber with rich green leaves. It is grown for its attractive unusually shaped flowers which are white with a pink flush and have blue or purple banded crowns. They are said to represent the Passion of Christ. These are followed by long-lasting orange fruits.

**Pennisetum alopecuroides 'Hameln' (Chinese Fountain Grass)**

Small perennial grass with dark green leaves which turn deep yellow in autumn. It is grown for its soft greenish-white flowerheads which sway gently in the wind in summer. Excellent for flower arranging. Prefers a sunny well-drained site.

**Pennisetum massaicum 'Red Bunny Tails' (Fountain Grass)**

Medium-sized annual or perennial grass-like plant grown for its reddish-pink rabbit tail-like flower heads, borne in summer and autumn, which highlight the burgundy-green foliage. The flowers fade to buff-white on maturity. Ideal for large containers, borders and pondsides.

**Pennisetum villosum (Feathertop grass)**

A wonderful small perennial clump-forming grass grown for its abundance of creamy-white fluffy feathery seedheads borne from June to October. Prefers a sunny well-drained site. Protect from hard frosts.

**Pennisetum villosum 'White Ladies'**

Wonderful small clump-forming perennial grass with narrow cascading leaves, grown for its abundance of brilliant white fluffy feathery seedheads borne on short spikes from June to October. Ideal for paths, borders or containers. Prefers a sunny well-drained site. Cut back in spring after frosts.

**Penstemon 'Alice Hindley'**

Medium-sized semi-evergreen perennial grown for its tubular lilac flowers with a white centre borne from mid-summer to autumn. A colourful elegant and reliable cottage garden perennial which flowers prolifically over a long period. Can be cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon 'Audrey Cooper'**

Medium-sized semi-evergreen perennial. It is grown for its bell-shaped flowers with cerise flowers with a white throat, which are produced from mid-summer to autumn. A colourful, elegant and reliable cottage garden perennial which flowers prolifically over a long period. Can be cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon 'Blackbird'**

Small to medium semi-evergreen perennial with long green leaves, grown for its tubular deep raspberry-coloured flowers borne from midsummer to first frosts. A colourful, elegant and reliable cottage garden perennial which flowers prolifically over a long period. Deadhead after flowering.



**Penstemon 'Firebird'**

Small to medium semi-evergreen perennial grown for its beautiful large tubular bell-shaped scarlet flowers from midsummer to early autumn. A reliable cottage garden perennial which flowers prolifically over a long period. Can be cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon 'Garnet'**

Medium-sized semi-evergreen perennial with narrow green leaves. Bell-shaped deep wine-red flowers are produced from mid-summer to autumn. A colourful, elegant and reliable cottage garden perennial which flowers prolifically over a long period. Can be cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon 'Hewell Pink Bedder'**

Medium-sized semi-evergreen perennial, grown for its delicate pink bell-shaped flowers produced profusely from midsummer to first frosts. This is one of the original cottage garden varieties, providing a colourful elegant and reliable addition to a sheltered bed or border.

**Penstemon 'Hidcote Pink'**

Small semi-evergreen perennial with narrow green leaves. Small tubular pale pink flowers with crimson lines inside are produced from mid-summer to first frosts. A colourful elegant and reliable cottage garden perennial which flowers prolifically over a long period. Can be cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon 'Pensham Amelia Jayne'**

Small to medium semi-evergreen perennial with narrow green leaves grown for its glorious deep pink bell-shaped flowers with large white throats, borne from midsummer to first frosts. Ideal for a cottage garden border, flowering prolifically over a long period. Cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon 'Pensham Czar'**

Small semi-evergreen perennial grown for its large colourful purple bell-shaped flowers with white throats, borne from midsummer until first frosts. Ideal for a cottage garden border, flowering prolifically over a long period. Cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon 'Pensham Eleanor Young'**

Small semi-evergreen perennial grown for its large cerise bell-shaped flowers with cerise and streaked white throats, borne from midsummer until first frosts. Ideal for a cottage garden border, flowering over a long period. Cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon 'Pensham Just Jayne'**

Medium-sized semi-evergreen perennial with narrow green leaves grown for its profusion of large colourful deep cerise-pink flowers with magenta and white throats, borne from early summer to mid autumn. Ideal for a dry sunny border. Deadhead after flowering and cut back after flowers have finished.

**Penstemon 'Pensham Plum Jerkum'**

Small to medium semi-evergreen perennial with narrow green leaves grown for its glorious bell-shaped plum-coloured flowers with white plum-dappled centres, borne from midsummer to first frosts. Ideal for a cottage garden border, flowering prolifically over a long period. Cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon 'Purple Bedder'**

Medium-sized semi-evergreen perennial with green leaves. Bell-shaped burgundy and magenta flowers are produced from mid-summer to first frosts. A colourful elegant and reliable cottage garden perennial which flowers prolifically over a long period. Can be cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon 'Raven'**

Medium-sized semi-evergreen perennial with narrow mid-green foliage, grown for its profusion of tubular rich deep purple flowers, borne from summer to early autumn. One of the darkest varieties of Penstemon. A colourful, elegant and reliable cottage garden perennial which flowers prolifically over a long period. Ideal for a sunny border.

**Penstemon 'Rubicundus'**

Large semi-evergreen perennial with green leaves. Large bell-shaped bright red flowers each with a white throat are produced from mid-summer to first frosts. A colourful elegant and reliable cottage garden perennial which flowers prolifically over a long period. Can be cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon 'Sour Grapes'**

Small to medium semi-evergreen perennial, grown for its attractive and unusual greyish-blue bell-shaped tubular flowers, beautifully marked with rich purple, borne from midsummer to first frosts. A colourful, elegant and reliable cottage garden perennial which flowers prolifically over a long period. Can be cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon 'The Juggler'**

Medium-sized semi-evergreen perennial grown for its bell-shaped purple and magenta flowers with a white throat produced from mid-summer to autumn. A colourful, elegant and reliable cottage garden perennial which flowers prolifically over a long period. Can be cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon 'Volcano Fujiyama'**

Small to medium semi-evergreen perennials, grown for its attractive large bell-shaped light pink flowers with white throats, borne from midsummer until first frosts. Ideal for a cottage garden border flowering prolifically over a long period. Deadhead regularly to prolong flowering. Can be cut back in spring.

**Penstemon 'Volcano Vesuvius'**

Small to medium semi-evergreen perennial, grown for its vibrant purple flowers with purple-streaked white throats, borne from midsummer until first frosts. Ideal for a cottage garden border flowering prolifically over a long period. Deadhead regularly to prolong flowering. Can be cut back in spring.

**Penstemon 'White Bedder'**

Medium-sized semi-evergreen perennial grown for its bell-shaped white flowers tinged pink produced from mid-summer to autumn. A colourful, elegant and reliable cottage garden perennial which flowers prolifically over a long period. Can be cut back in late spring.

**Penstemon digitalis 'Husker Red'**

Small perennial grown for its striking maroon-red and green ivory leaves, which highlight the pink-tinged white bell-shaped flowers which are borne profusely throughout the summer. Ideal for a border for that cottage garden effect, or for a container. Prefers a sunny well-drained sheltered site. Remove flowerheads as they fade.

**Perovskia 'Blue Spire' (Russian Sage)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub with grey-white stems and aromatic toothed silvery-grey leaves. It bears a profusion of violet-blue flower spikes from late summer to mid-autumn. Best cut down to 10 inches in spring to keep a good shape. Very effective in a cottage garden setting.

**Persicaria affinis 'Donald Lowndes'**

Low-growing semi-evergreen mat-forming perennial grown for its abundance of spikes of pink, red and white flowers which are produced over a long period from summer to early winter. This is an ideal plant for ground cover in sun or shade.

**Persicaria bistorta 'Superba'**

Small clump-forming perennial with green dock-like leaves, grown for its profusion of tall poker-like spikes of pink flowers borne from June to September. Ideal for a mixed border or bog garden. Very easy to grow, attractive and colourful.

**Persicaria microcephala 'Red Dragon'**

Low-growing semi-evergreen shrub, grown for its striking small purplish-red leaves with a central splash of plum or mint which appear on gracefully arching branches. Small white flowers are produced in spring and summer. This lovely foliage plant contrasts well with other shrubs in a mixed border.

**Persicaria virginiana Variegated Group 'Painter's Palette' (v)**

Small to medium spreading herbaceous perennial grown for its variegated green and yellow leaves with central v-shaped brown marks, deep pinkish red tints and red midribs and stalks. It may produce cup-shaped green flowers turning red in late summer and early autumn. Contact with all parts may irritate skin; sap may cause mild stomach upset if ingested.

**Phalaris arundinacea 'Arctic Sun' (v)**

Medium-sized compact deciduous grass grown for its leaves which are striped with vivid creamy yellow and green, and tall stems with heads of golden flowers in summer. Ideal for ground cover or beside a pond or stream. Cut back any old growth in early summer to encourage fresh growth.

**Phalaris arundinacea var. picta 'Feesey' (v) (Gardener's Garters)**

Medium-sized semi-evergreen spreading perennial grass grown for its upright green and white striped leaves with a pink tinge. Can be divided in spring. This is a fast-growing alternative to bamboo.

**Philadelphus 'Belle Etoile' (Mock Orange)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub with arching branches bearing mid-green leaves and a profusion of highly fragrant cup-shaped single white flowers with maroon centres from late spring to early summer.

**Philadelphus 'Manteau d'Hermine' (Mock Orange)**

Small compact deciduous shrub with small mid-green leaves and clusters of very fragrant double creamy-white flowers borne in early and mid-summer. Ideal for the small garden.

**Philadelphus coronarius aureus (Mock Orange)**

Medium to large deciduous shrub grown for its golden-yellow leaves and clusters of very fragrant single creamy-white flowers in late spring and early summer. Can scorch in full sun. Can be trimmed after flowering to encourage a more compact shape.

**Phlomis cashmeriana**

Medium-size upright perennial with woolly sage-like grey-green leaves, grown for its unusual large hooded lilac-purple flowers borne in midsummer. Very effective in a border in a sheltered site, or against a wall. Seedheads may be left for their ornamental effect.

**Phlomis fruticosa (Jerusalem Sage)**

Small to medium mound-forming evergreen shrub with furry grey-green leaves and conspicuous whorls of unusual hooded bright yellow flowers in early to mid-summer. Prefers a sunny well-drained site.

**Phlomis russeliana**

Small to medium evergreen perennial with large heart-shaped leaves, grown for its unusual hooded butter-yellow flowers produced throughout the summer. Excellent as ground cover. Prefers a sunny site.

**Phlox 'Coral Flame'**

Small bush perennial grown for its masses of coral flowers in mid to late summer. Looks stunning in a border or rockery. Prefers a sunny site. Feeding is recommended to promote flowering. Can be divided in autumn or spring.

**Phlox White Eye Flame (syn. 'Barsixty')**

Small to medium compact perennial, grown for its masses of fragrant white blossoms with a red eye, flowering from July to October. Ideal for a border or rockery in a sunny site.

**Phlox paniculata 'Blue Paradise'**

Medium-sized herbaceous perennials grown for its masses of heads of fragrant hydrangea-like warm blue flowers with purple eyes on tall stems. The flowers open pale blue and darken to deep violet blue, the colour changing from blue to purple with the light. This variety is resistant to mildew. Attractive to butterflies and bees.

**Phlox paniculata 'Purple Eye Flame' (syn. 'Barthirtythree')**

Small short bushy perennial grown for its masses of purple flowers with white centres which look stunning in a border or rockery in early summer. Prefers a sunny site. Feeding will promote flowering. Can be divided in autumn or spring.

**Phlox paniculata 'Lilac Time'**

Small clump-forming perennial with green lance-shaped leaves, grown for its profusion of large showy lilac-blue flowerheads borne over a long period from July to September. Ideal for a sunny border or can be used for mass planting. Remove faded flowerheads to prolong flowering. Highly attractive to birds.

**Phlox paniculata 'Velvet Flame'**

Small short bushy perennial grown for its masses of velvet purple-blue flowers which look stunning in a border or rockery in early summer. Prefers a sunny site. Feeding will promote flowering. Can be divided in autumn or spring.

**Phormium 'Alison Blackman'**

Medium-sized evergreen perennial, grown for its striking sword-like leaves which have olive-green centres with golden stripes and margins. Makes an excellent architectural focal point. Prefers a sunny well-drained site.

**Phormium 'Apricot Queen'**

Large evergreen perennial grown for its long strap-like bronze-green leaves with broad apricot-yellow centres. The colour of the leaves intensifies with age. Makes an excellent architectural focal point in a border or lawn. Ideal for coastal gardens. Prefers a sunny site.

**Phormium 'Black Velvet'**

Lovely medium-sized evergreen perennial grown for its long narrow stiff arching dark blackish grey-green leaves. Impossible to describe in words, but highly effective in a sunny well-drained border. Makes an excellent architectural focal point.

**Phormium 'Bronze Baby'**

Medium-sized evergreen perennial, with striking sword-like leaves which are an attractive copper-bronze colour. Tall panicles of red flowers are borne above the leaves in summer. Makes an excellent architectural focal point. Prefers a sunny well-drained site.

**Phormium 'Evening Glow' (v)**

Small to medium-sized evergreen perennial, grown for its striking bright red-pink narrow sword-like leaves with narrow bronze margins and stripes. Tall panicles of red flowers are sometimes borne above the leaves in summer. Makes an excellent architectural focal point. Prefers a sunny well-drained site.

**Phormium 'Gold Ray'**

Medium-sized evergreen perennial, grown for its striking sword-like leaves which are green with golden-yellow variegated margins and orange-pink edges. Ideal to give a tropical look to your garden. It makes an excellent architectural focal point. Prefers a well-drained sunny site.

**Phormium 'Gold Sword'**

Striking medium upright sturdy evergreen perennial with broad stiff bright golden yellow leaves banded green. Resistant to maritime exposure. Avoid planting too deeply. Ideal for containers.

**Phormium 'Jester'**

Large evergreen perennial, grown for its striking long strap-like leaves which are lime green in the centre with pink edges. Makes a wonderful architectural focal point. Ideal for a sunny border.

**Phormium 'Maori Maiden' Also known as 'Rainbow Maiden'.**

Small evergreen perennial suitable for tubs and basket. It has delicate weeping leaves in rich rosy salmon pink to coral red, banded with bronze margins.

**Phormium 'Maori Queen' (v)**

Medium-sized upright evergreen perennial with broad bronze, green and red striped leaves which grows to a height of 3 feet. Tall panicles of yellow-green flowers are borne above the leaves in summer. Makes an excellent architectural focal point. Prefers a sunny well-drained site.

**Phormium 'Maori Sunrise' (v)**

Medium-sized evergreen perennial with striking slender sword-like apricot and pink striped leaves with bronze margins. Makes an excellent architectural focal point. Prefers a sunny well-drained site.

**Phormium 'Pink Panther' (v)**

Striking medium-sized evergreen perennial grown for its stunning sword-like variegated candy-pink leaves, with red margins. Makes a wonderful architectural focal point. Ideal for a sunny well-drained border.

**Phormium 'Pink Stripe'**

Striking medium-sized evergreen perennial grown for its long strap-like leaves, which are olive-green margined with a vivid pink. Makes a wonderful architectural focal point. Ideal for a sunny well-drained border.

**Phormium 'Sundowner' (v)**

Medium-sized evergreen perennial with striking sword-like bronze-green leaves with dark rose-pink margins. Makes an excellent architectural focal point. Prefers a sunny well-drained site.

**Phormium 'Sunset'**

Medium erect evergreen perennial with stunning bronze leaves overlaid with gold and apricot and with green stripes and margins. Highly valued for floral decoration. Ideal for containers.

**Phormium 'Yellow Wave' (v)**

Medium-sized evergreen perennial with striking sword-like leaves which are an attractive yellow-green colour. Makes an excellent architectural focal point. Prefers a sunny well-drained site.

**Phormium cookianum subsp. hookeri "Tricolor"**

Medium evergreen perennial with striking sword-like creamy-yellow leaves with a red edge and yellow panicles of flowers from early summer to early autumn. Needs a sheltered site

**Phormium tenax (New Zealand Flax)**

Large evergreen perennial with striking greenish-blue sword-like leaves and tall flower stalks turning to unusual black seed pods. Makes an excellent architectural focal point. Prefers a sunny well-drained site.

**Phormium tenax Purpureum Group (Purple New Zealand Flax)**

Medium-sized evergreen perennial with striking sword-like leaves which are rich reddish-purple to dark copper in colour and tall flower stalks turning to unusual black seed pods. Makes an excellent architectural focal point. Prefers a sunny well-drained site.

**Photinia x fraseri 'Red Robin'**

Large evergreen shrub with spectacular bright red young leaves fading to green as they mature. Can be pruned to shape when the colour fades to encourage fresh new growth. Ideal for contrast in a mixed border.

**Phygелиus aequalis 'Yellow Trumpet'**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub grown for its showy tubular pale creamy-yellow flowers which appear in early summer. Remove dead heads to prolong flowering. Cut back dead wood in late spring to keep shape.

**Phygelius x rectus 'Salmon Leap'**

Medium-sized compact evergreen shrub, grown for its lovely bright salmon tubular flowers which are borne from early summer to early autumn. Remove dead heads to prolong flowering. Cut back dead wood in late spring to keep a good shape.

**Phygelius x rectus Somerford Funfair Orange**

Compact small to medium evergreen perennial with olive-green leaves grown for its vivid orange trumpet-shaped blooms borne over a long period in summer and into autumn. Remove dead heads to prolong flowering. Prefers a sunny sheltered site. Ideal for a shrub or herbaceous border.

**Phygelius x rectus Somerford Funfair Wine**

Compact small to medium evergreen perennial grown for its rich wine trumpet-shaped blooms borne over a long period in summer and into autumn. Remove dead heads to prolong flowering. Prefers a sunny sheltered site. Ideal for a shrub or herbaceous border.

**Phygelius x rectus Somerford Funfair Yellow**

Compact small to medium evergreen perennial grown for its soft creamy-yellow trumpet-shaped blooms borne over a long period in summer and into autumn. Remove dead heads to prolong flowering. Prefers a sunny sheltered site. Ideal for a shrub or herbaceous border.

**Phygelius x rectus Somerford Funfair Cream**

Compact small to medium evergreen perennial with olive-green leaves grown for its soft cream trumpet-shaped blooms borne over a long period in summer and into autumn. Remove dead heads to prolong flowering. Prefers a sunny sheltered site. Ideal for a shrub or herbaceous border.

**Physocarpus Lady in Red (syn 'Tulad')**

Medium to large deciduous shrub with peeling bark grown for its striking foliage, coppery orange when new, turning brilliant chestnut red to wine, and finally fading to dark purple. Small, cup-shaped, pink-tinged white flowers are borne in early summer followed by clusters of red fruit with green flushes. Prefers acid soil in full sun or part shade. Cut back after flowering

**Physocarpus opulifolius 'Dart's Gold'**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its striking golden-yellow foliage. It has clusters of tiny white flowers in early summer. Makes a bold contrast to purple and bronze-leaved plants in a mixed border.

**Physocarpus opulifolius 'Diabolo' (Ninebark)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its striking dark purple foliage. It has clusters of tiny white flowers in early summer. Makes a bold contrast to golden and silver-leaved plants in a mixed border.

**Physostegia virginiana 'Rosea' (Obedient plant)**

Medium spreading perennial grown for its abundant upright spikes of rose pink snapdragon-like flowers which appear from midsummer to early autumn above dense clumps of deep green foliage. Ideal for borders.

**Picea abies (Christmas Tree or Norway Spruce)**

Large fast-growing conifer with dark green needles and pendulous cones. The traditional Christmas Tree!

**Picea glauca 'J W Daisy's White'**

Small evergreen cone-shaped bush of dense compact habit, grown for its stunning foliage. Cream coloured shoots emerge in spring, the foliage is white all summer and reverts to grey-green with yellow variation in winter. Ideal for a sunny well-drained site in a border

**Picea glauca var. albertiana 'Conica'**

Dwarf, neat, perfectly cone-shaped slow-growing bushy conifer of compact habit with bright grass-green needles. An attractive and popular variety, which grows only 2 metres in 30 years.

**Picea omorica**

Large narrow spire-like evergreen coniferous tree with dark blue-green leaves, white beneath, and reddish-brown cones in spring. Grows quickly to form a tall graceful slender tree. Ideal for a specimen tree.

**Pieris 'Flaming Silver' (v)**

A small, dense-growing evergreen shrub, grown for its attractive leaves which are bright red when young and develop a striking silvery-white margin, pink at first. Produces creamy white flowers in April and May. Prefers acidic soil.

**Pieris 'Forest Flame'**

Immensely popular medium to large evergreen shrub whose young leaves are the brightest red of all Pieris, becoming pink, then cream, and finally dark green, with small clusters of bell-shaped white flowers in spring. Prefers acid soil. Will tolerate a shady site.

**Pieris japonica 'Little Heath' (v)**

A dwarf compact evergreen shrub with small toothed glossy green leaves that have silvery-white margins, pink-flushed when young. White flowers are produced in semi-erect terminal panicles from late winter to early spring.

**Pieris japonica 'Little Heath Green'**

Dwarf evergreen shrub with glossy green leaves, bronze red when young, and red stems in winter. Prefers acid soil. Will tolerate a shady site.

**Pinus mugo (Dwarf or Swiss Mountain Pine)**

Medium to large spreading shrubby conifer with very dark green needle-like leaves and brown cones. Ideal for seaside areas. Thrives in poor soil.

**Pittosporum 'Garnetti'**

Medium to large evergreen shrub grown for its attractive grey-green leaves which have delicate creamy-white margins and are pink spotted in winter, forming a dense bushy cone. It may bear small greenish-purple flowers in spring and summer. Prefers a sheltered site. Makes an attractive backdrop in a mixed border.

**Pittosporum eugenoides 'Variegatum' (Lemonwood)**

Small evergreen tree, conical when young, becoming rounder with age. Grown for its long glossy leaves with cream or creamy-yellow margins, which are lemon-scented when crushed, and small fragrant star-shaped greenish-yellow flowers in summer, followed by small brown fruits. Makes a good specimen tree.



**Pittosporum tenuifolium**

Medium to large evergreen dense rounded shrub grown for its glossy wavy-edged mid-green leaves on purple shoots. It bears honey-scented chocolate-purple flowers in late spring. Popular foliage for flower arranging. It can be trimmed to shape after flowering. Can be used for hedging.

**Pittosporum tenuifolium 'Abbotsbury Gold' (f/v)**

Medium to large dense rounded evergreen shrub grown for its yellow leaves with irregular green margins which are ideal for flower arranging. Can be trimmed to shape. Prefers a sheltered site.

**Pittosporum tenuifolium 'Elizabeth' (m/v)**

Large evergreen shrub grown for its attractive grey-green wavy leaves, edged in cream and flushed pink in winter. Small chocolate-purple flowers are borne from March to April. Ideal for a mixed sunny border or hedge.

**Pittosporum tenuifolium 'Gold Star'**

Small to medium slow-growing compact evergreen shrub, grown for its yellow foliage turning green-yellow variegated on red stems and tiny lilac flowers in late spring. Ideal for a sunny border or low hedge or for a patio. Adds year-round colour to the garden.

**Pittosporum tenuifolium 'Silver Magic' (v)**

Medium to large dense evergreen shrub grown for its black stems and attractive small silvery-green leaves with pink-tinged green margins. Ideal for a sunny sheltered border. Can be trimmed to shape in spring.

**Pittosporum tenuifolium 'Silver Queen' (f/v)**

Medium to large dense evergreen shrub grown for its attractive grey-green leaves with irregular white margins. Can be trimmed to shape in spring. Prefers a sunny sheltered site.

**Pittosporum tenuifolium 'Tom Thumb'**

Small slow-growing neat compact evergreen shrub, forming a low bush of stunning glossy purple foliage. Ideal for a small garden in a sunny site for best leaf colour.

**Pittosporum tenuifolium 'Variegatum' (m/v)**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub grown for its attractive small green leaves with irregular white margins. Ideal for flower arranging. Can be trimmed to shape in spring. This variety is especially suited to the small garden. Prefers a sunny sheltered site.

**Pittosporum tobira 'Variegatum' (v)**

Large shrub with a rounded and dense shape. Has leathery, lustrous deep green leaves with white margins. Bears large, very sweetly scented, creamy white flowers in late spring and early summer.

**Pleioblastus auricomus (Bamboo)**

Small evergreen spreading bamboo, the best of the variegated bamboos. It has purple stems and narrow bright yellow leaves which are broadly striped with green. Ideal for tranquil pondsides, and oriental gardens. Can also be grown as a patio plant.

**Pleioblastus pygmaeus**

A lovely compact dwarf Japanese bamboo grown for its tough bright green evergreen leaves that fan out giving the appearance of a palm or fern. Its spreading carpet-forming growth makes it a perfect groundcover plant. Also good for a Japanese garden or to grow in a container.

**Pleiblastus variegatus (v) (Dwarf white-striped bamboo)**

Medium-sized evergreen dwarf white-striped, slow-spreading bamboo with pale green stems and narrow dark green leaves with white or cream stripes. Ideal for tranquil pondsides and oriental gardens. Can also be grown in a pot as a patio plant.

**Pleiblastus variegatus 'Tsuboi' (v)**

Dwarf evergreen bamboo with pale green waxy canes and green and white striped leaves, growing to a maximum height of 30 inches and spread of 4 feet. Ideal for tranquil pond-sides and Oriental gardens. Can also be grown in a pot as a patio plant.

**Polemonium 'Heaven Scent'**

Small easy-to-grow perennial, which forms a ferny mound of green foliage with deep purple-blue highlights from spring until summer, grown for its loose clusters of lightly fragrant blue-purple bell-shaped flowers borne throughout spring. Prefers partial shade. This plant is said to be deer-resistant!

**Polemonium yezoense var. hidakanum 'Purple Rain' (Jacob's Ladder)**

Medium-sized deciduous perennial grown for its contrasting dark purple leaves and sapphire blue flowers borne in late spring. Ideal for a border or wild garden. Deadhead regularly.

**Polypodium vulgare (Common polypody)**

Evergreen low-growing fern, grown for its thick leathery deeply cut green fronds, to give a prehistoric look to your garden. Ideal for walls, banks and rockeries. Remove old fronds in spring after late frosts to allow new growth to uncurl. Mulch in bad frosts.

**Polystichum:**

A selection of hardy semi-evergreen ferns are available.

**Potentilla 'Gibson's Scarlet'**

Small to medium herbaceous perennial with attractively divided dark green leaves, grown for its clusters of brilliant scarlet dark-eyed saucer-shaped five petalled flowers which appear over a long period throughout the summer. Ideal for a well-drained sunny site in a cottage garden-type border or gravel bed.

**Potentilla fruticosa 'Abbotswood'**

Small deciduous shrub with small dark blue-green leaves grown for its abundance of pretty pure-white flowers borne over a long season in summer and autumn. They are easy to grow and ideal for a low border.

**Potentilla fruticosa 'Goldfinger'**

Small to medium deciduous shrub with attractive bright green leaves which set off the profusion of rich yellow flowers which are borne from late spring to late summer. Easy to grow and ideal for a low border.

**Potentilla fruticosa 'New Dawn'**

Small deciduous shrub grown for its masses of small rose-like pink flowers which are deeper pink in the centre fading to white at the edge. This variety does not fade in the sun like other varieties. Thrives in any soil in sun or partial shade. Ideal for providing colour in a herbaceous border.

**Potentilla fruticosa 'Pink Beauty' (syn. 'Lovely Pink' )**

Small to medium deciduous shrub, grown for its masses of clear pink flowers with yellow centres borne from May throughout the summer. Grow in partial shade for best flower colour and longer lasting flowers. Ideal for beds and borders.

**Potentilla fruticosa 'Pretty Polly'**

Small deciduous shrub with small green leaves and masses of dainty rosy-pink flowers which fade in strong sunlight, borne from late spring to late summer. Easy to grow, ideal for a low border.

**Potentilla fruticosa 'Red Ace'**

Small deciduous shrub with small bright green leaves grown for its profusion of bright scarlet flowers borne from late spring to late summer which fade to orange in sunlight. Easy to grow, ideal for a low border.

**Potentilla nepalensis 'Miss Willmott'**

Small clump-forming perennial with attractive mid-green leaves, grown for its masses of cherry-pink flowers, suffused yellow, with darker pink centres, which are borne throughout the summer. Ideal for providing colour in a herbaceous border.

**Primula beesiana**

Small deciduous candelabra-type primula with rosettes of long mid-green leaves, grown for its profusion of heads of colourful yellow-eyed reddish-pink flowerheads in summer. Prefers a moist site. Ideal for a woodland site, by a pond, or in a bog garden.

**Primula bulleyana**

Small semi-evergreen perennial Candelabra-type primula with rosettes of long green leaves, grown for its colourful profusion of orange flowerheads in summer, which fade to yellow. Prefers a moist shady site. Ideal for a bog garden, pond or stream-side. Can be grown in a sunny site if the soil is moist.

**Primula florindae (Giant Cowslip)**

Medium-sized rosette-forming perennial grown for its tall stems of bell-shaped sulphur-yellow flowers which are borne in late spring and summer, over bright green foliage. Ideal for a border or wildlife garden.

**Primula japonica 'Apple Blossom'**

Small deciduous perennial with long pale green leaves, grown for its tall stems bearing profuse clusters of soft pink flowers with a red eye borne in late spring and early summer. Ideal for growing in clumps by a stream or in a bog garden.

**Primula japonica 'Miller's Crimson' (Japanese Primrose)**

A lovely medium-sized candelabra-type perennial grown for its stout stems bearing crimson flowers in late spring. Needs a damp shady site. Ideal for growing in groups by a stream or in a bog garden.

**Primula prolifera (syn. helodoxa)**

Small evergreen perennial candelabra-type primula with deep green leaves, grown for its stems bearing beautiful pale to golden yellow or occasionally violet flowers, borne in early summer. Prefers a shady moist site. Ideal for a pondside or bog garden.

**Primula veris (Cowslip)**

This lovely small native evergreen perennial with long green leaves is grown for its heads of nodding fragrant deep yellow flowers borne in long-stalked clusters in mid or late spring. Ideal for rock gardens, borders or wildlife gardens. Can be naturalised in grassland.

**Prunus 'Okame'**

Bushy, deciduous medium-sized tree with dark green leaves, turning an attractive orange-red in autumn. In early spring profuse numbers of attractive pink flowers are borne in clusters.

**Prunus incisa 'Kojo-no-mai' (Fuji cherry)**

Spreading slow-growing deciduous large shrub or small tree, with long yellow-green leaves which turn mid-green in summer, grown for its profusion of pink to pale red flowers opening on zig zag shoots from light red buds in very early spring. Ideal specimen tree.

**Prunus laurocerasus (Common or Cherry Laurel)**

Large evergreen dense bushy shrub with large glossy bright green leaves. It has long spikes of small single white fragrant flowers followed by cherry-like red fruits which turn black - the kernels are harmful if eaten. Excellent for hedging, plant 2 to 3 feet apart. Can be cut back hard in spring.

**Prunus lusitanica (Portuguese laurel)**

Large evergreen shrub or small tree with red-stalked glossy dark green evergreen leaves. Long heads of fragrant white cup-shaped flowers are borne in early summer, followed by cherry-like red fruit which ripen to black. Ideal hedging plant, or can be used as a specimen tree.

**Pyracantha 'Mohave'**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub with glossy green leaves on spiny branches and small white flowers in summer, followed by clusters of reddish-orange berries throughout the winter. Ideal wall shrub or vandal-resistant hedge plant which attracts birds and bees to the garden.

**Pyracantha 'Saphyr Rouge'**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub with glossy green leaves on spiny branches and small white flowers in summer, followed by a profusion of bright yellow berries throughout the winter. Ideal wall shrub or vandal resistant hedge plant which attracts birds and bees to the garden.

**Pyracantha coccinea 'Red Column'**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub of upright habit with reddish shoots and glossy green leaves on spiny branches. Small white flowers in summer are followed by clusters of scarlet berries throughout the winter. Ideal wall shrub or vandal-resistant hedge plant which attracts birds and bees to the garden.

**Pyracantha 'Teton'**

Large evergreen shrub with glossy bright green leaves. It bears clusters of small white flowers on spiny branches in summer, followed by a profusion of yellow-orange berries throughout the winter. This variety is highly resistant to fireblight. Ideal wall shrub or hedge plant which attracts birds and bees to the garden.

**Pyracantha coccinea 'Red Column'**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub of upright habit with reddish shoots and glossy green leaves on spiny branches. Small white flowers in summer are followed by clusters of scarlet berries throughout the winter. Ideal wall shrub or vandal-resistant hedge plant which attracts birds and bees to the garden.

**Ranunculus ficaria 'Brazen Hussy' (Lesser Celandine)**

Stunning small perennial grown for its glossy deep chocolate-brown leaves and shining golden yellow flowers produced in early spring. Ideal for a shady woodland site. Leaves die down after flowering in summer.

**Rhododendrons:**

A small selection of small to medium sized evergreen varieties are available.

**Ribes sanguineum 'Pulborough Scarlet' (Flowering Currant)**

Medium to large deciduous shrub grown for its clusters of small dark red flowers in early spring. Ideal for the mixed border to bring early colour to the garden. Very reliable flowerer which will grow in any situation.

**Rodgersia pinnata**

Medium-sized perennial grown for its large, heavily-veined, glossy dark green leaves with reddish-green stalks. Produces star-shaped white-pink flowers in mid to late summer. Prefers moist soil in full sun or partial shade. Excellent near water or for woodland gardens.

**Roses:**

**Rosmarinus officinalis (Common Rosemary)**

Small to medium evergreen shrub with highly aromatic needle-like grey-green leaves. Small purplish-blue flowers appear along the stems from mid-spring to early summer and often again in autumn. Ideal for the cottage or herb garden. It has herbal and culinary uses. Prefers a dry site. Best pruned straight after flowering to keep tidy.

**Rosmarinus officinalis 'Miss Jessopp's Upright'**

Small to medium evergreen upright shrub with highly aromatic needle-like dark green leaves. Small blue flowers appear along the stems from mid-spring to early summer and often again in autumn. Ideal for the cottage or herb garden with herbal and culinary uses. Its upright habit makes it a good choice for hedging. Prefers a sunny, dry sheltered site. Best pruned straight after flowering to keep tidy.

**Rosmarinus officinalis Prostratus group (lavandulaceus)**

Low-growing evergreen shrub with highly aromatic needle-like grey-green leaves and small blue flowers in late spring and early summer. Ideal for the cottage or herb garden. It has herbal and culinary uses. Prefers a sunny, dry site. Best pruned straight after flowering to keep tidy.

**Rubus cockburnianus**

Large deciduous shrub with arching prickly shoots with a brilliant white hue in winter. The leaves are dark green above and white hairy beneath, giving an overall greenish-white effect. Bears heads of saucer-shaped purple flowers at the end of the branches in summer, followed by black fruits. Ideal for a shrub border in a sunny spot.

**Rubus thibetanus 'Silver Fern'**

Medium to large deciduous shrub with purplish-brown stems covered with a blue-white hue. Grown for its fern-like greyish-silver hairy leaves, small saucer-shaped red-purple flowers and black or red fruits in summer. Ideal for a sunny shrub border.

**Rudbeckia fulgida var. sullivantii 'Goldsturm' (Coneflower)**

Small to medium upright perennial, grown for its masses of daisy-like golden flowerheads with black centres which appear in late summer and autumn. Ideal for an eye-catching display with a cottage garden effect. Good for cut flowers.

**Salvia microphylla var. microphylla**

Medium evergreen shrub, grown for its beautiful bright crimson, magenta, pink or purple flowers, which appear in late summer and autumn. Ideal for a sunny border, light woodland or wildflower meadow. Attractive to bees.

**Salvia microphylla var. microphylla 'Newby Hall'**

Medium evergreen shrub, grown for its beautiful bright crimson, magenta, pink or purple flowers, which appear in late summer and autumn. Ideal for a sunny border, light woodland or wildflower meadow. Attractive to bees.

**Salvia officinalis (Common Sage)**

Small evergreen shrub with highly aromatic grey-green leaves and pretty lilac-blue flowers in early and mid-summer. Ideal for cottage garden and herb garden. Attractive to bees. Prefers a sunny site.

**Salvia officinalis 'Purpurascens'**

Small evergreen shrub with highly aromatic dark purple-green leaves borne on purple stems. Blue-purple flowers are produced in summer. Ideal for cottage and herb garden. Attractive to bees. Needs sunny sheltered site.

**Salvia uliginosa 'African Skies' (Bog Sage)**

Clump-forming moisture-loving deciduous perennial which grows to a height of 5 feet. It is grown for its beautiful sky-blue flowers borne from late summer to mid-autumn. Prefers a moist sunny site. Ideal for the back of a damp border. Protect from frosts.

**Sambucus nigra 'Eva' (syn.' Black Lace')**

Large deciduous bushy shrub, grown for its striking purple-black glossy deeply-cut foliage and pink-tinged flowerheads in early summer, followed by glossy black elderberry fruits.

**Santolina chamaecyparissus (Cotton Lavender)**

Small evergreen mound-forming aromatic shrub with silvery grey-green feathery foliage and dainty button-like yellow flowerheads in mid and late summer. Prefers a hot dry site in well-drained soil. Best pruned each year after flowering.

**Santolina rosmarinifolia (Holy Flax)**

Small evergreen mound-forming aromatic shrub with vivid green feathery foliage which contrasts beautifully with the bright yellow button-like flowerheads in mid-summer. Prefers a hot dry site in well-drained soil. Best pruned each year after flowering.

**Sarcococca confusa (Christmas Box)**

Medium-sized rounded bushy shrub with glossy dark green leaves, grown for its highly fragrant white flowers which are borne in winter, and are followed by glossy black fruits. Ideal for ground cover in a woodland garden, or as a low informal hedge.

**Schizostylis coccinea 'Fenland Daybreak' (syn. Hesperantha)**

Attractive small to medium evergreen perennial, forming a slowly spreading clump, with tall narrow green leaves, and delicate showy gladiolus-like orange-pink spikes from late summer to early autumn. Adds colour to the garden at end of season. Ideal for the front of a mixed or herbaceous border. Grows well in a sunny sheltered site. Can be divided in spring.

**Schizostylis coccinea 'Major' (syn. Hesperantha)**

Small evergreen perennial with long narrow green sword-shaped leaves, grown for its showy gladiolus-like spikes of large red flowers produced from late summer to early winter. Ideal for the front of a border or a sunny sheltered courtyard garden. Divide in spring.

**Schizostylis coccinea 'Pink Princess' (syn. Hesperantha)**

Attractive small evergreen perennial grown for its showy gladiolus-like spikes of pale pink flowers with darker pink streaks, borne from late summer to early winter adding colour to the garden at the end of the season. Grows well in a sunny sheltered site. Can be divided in spring.

**Sedum 'Ruby Glow'**

Small mound-forming perennial with attractive grey-blue foliage which contrasts well with the dense heads of ruby-red flowers produced in summer. Prefers a sunny well-drained site. The top dies off in winter.

**Sedum Autumn Joy (syn. Herbstfreude') (Stonecrop)**

Attractive small perennial with a stunning display of pale pink flowerheads from midsummer to mid-autumn, turning salmon-pink then coppery-red. Flowers contrast beautifully with neat clumps of bluish-grey fleshy leaves. Ideal for well-drained sunny border. Attractive to bees. All parts may cause mild stomach upset if ingested, contact with sap may irritate skin.

**Sedum acre subsp. neglectum var. majus (Stonecrop)**

Small evergreen mat-forming perennial with fleshy bright green leaves. The tops of the plants are smothered with bright yellow star-like flowers in May. Ideal for rockeries, walls and dry sunny sites.

**Sedum spathulifolium 'Cape Blanco'**

Small mat-forming evergreen perennial, grown for its attractive silvery-grey fleshy leaves and attractive star-shaped bright yellow flowers in summer. Ideal for rockeries or the front of borders in a sunny well-drained site.

**Sedum spectabile (Ice Plant)**

Small clump-forming upright perennial with fleshy grey-green leaves. It is grown for its flat heads of star-shaped rose pink flowers in late summer which are highly attractive to butterflies and bees. The top dies off in winter.

**Sedum spurium 'Tricolor (v) syn. 'Variegatum'**

Attractive small evergreen mat-forming perennial, grown for its attractive pink-tinged green leaves with cream margins, borne on red stems, and charming pink flowers produced from July to September. Prefers a sunny well-drained site. Ideal for a rock garden, or the front of a border.

### **Sedum telephium 'Purple Emperor'**

Attractive perennial growing to a height of 18 inches. It is grown for its dark purple-red, almost black, fleshy leaves, silver-blue when young and its unusual heads of dusky-red flowers produced in summer. Ideal contrast for a mixed border. Prefers a sunny well-drained site. The top dies off in winter.

### **Sidalcea 'Party Girl'**

Large clump-forming perennial which produces delightful bright pink hollyhock-type flowers on slender stems from early to late summer. Suitable for mixed borders. Prefers a well-drained sunny position.

### **Sisyrinchium striatum**

Small evergreen clump-forming perennial with long narrow grey-green leaves, grown for its lovely cluster of pale yellow flowers from early to mid summer. Prefers a dry sunny site. Ideal for a herbaceous border.

### **Solanum crispum 'Glasnevin' (Chilean Potato Tree)**

Vigorous semi-evergreen climber or large bush grown for its abundance of purple flowers with yellow centres, borne throughout summer and autumn. Needs support if grown as a climber. Ideal for fences, sheds, archways or walls. Avoid exposed sites.

### **Solanum laxum 'Album' (Potato Vine)**

Large semi-evergreen climber grown for its profuse clusters of white jasmine-like flowers in summer and autumn. Needs support and a sheltered sunny site or protected wall.

### **Sorbus sorbifolia 'Sem'**

Small to medium deciduous shrub grown for its highly attractive foliage. The unusual delicate leaves are bronze when young, changing through pale green to dark green throughout the summer. Ideal planted in small groups, or alone in a low border. Looks good in a pot on a patio or balcony.

### **Spiraea 'Arguta' (Foam of May or Bridal Wreath)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub grown for its profuse clusters of white flowers borne along graceful arching branches in mid and late spring. Ideal for a sunny border. Trim after flowering.

### **Spiraea japonica 'Candlelight'**

Dwarf compact bushy deciduous shrub with buttery-yellow young leaves that gradually turn deeper yellow, setting off the profuse heads of pink flowers borne from midsummer onwards. Has attractive leaf colour in autumn. Ideal for a sunny border.

### **Spiraea japonica 'Firelight'**

Small deciduous shrub with rich deep orange young foliage changing to bright golden throughout the summer. It bears flat heads of deep rose-pink flowers from mid to late summer. Trim after flowering. The foliage contrasts well in a mixed border.

### **Spiraea japonica 'Genpei' (syn. 'Shirobana')**

Small deciduous shrub with green leaves grown for its very unusual mixture of deep pink, light pink and white flowerheads during early summer giving it a spectacular appearance. Trim after flowering.



**Spiraea japonica 'Goldflame'**

Small deciduous shrub with orange young foliage changing to bright golden throughout the summer. It bears flat heads of deep rose pink flowers from mid to late summer. Trim after flowering. The foliage contrasts well in a mixed border.

**Spiraea japonica 'Gold Mound'**

Dwarf deciduous shrub grown for its unusual lime-green to yellow foliage which forms an attractive mound. It bears flat heads of pale pink flowers in summer. Trim after flowering. The foliage contrasts well in a mixed border.

**Stachys byzantina (Lamb's ears)**

Small evergreen mat-forming perennial with lovely white-woolly silver-green leaves. From early summer to early autumn it bears spikes of woolly pink-purple flowers. Ideal for edging or ground cover in a sunny site.

**Stachys officinalis 'Hummelo' (Wood betony)**

Small to medium perennial grown for its attractive dense spikes of pinkish purple tubular flowers borne profusely from early summer to early autumn. Thrives in sun or part shade. Divide clumps in autumn or spring and cut back to ground level in early winter. Attractive to bees and butterflies.

**Stipa arundinacea (Pheasant's Tail Grass) syn Anemanthele lessoniana**

Medium-sized evergreen perennial grass with green leaves which turn a delightful soft orange in late summer. In autumn it bears decorative purplish-green flower spikes. A particularly attractive grass.

**Stipa gigantea (Golden Oats or Giant Feather Grass)**

Large evergreen clump-forming grass with mid-green leaves. The eye-catching silvery-green spikes, turning golden, are borne on stems up to 4 feet long, and sway gracefully in the breeze. Prefers a sunny site.

**Stipa tenuissima (Mexican Feather Grass)**

Medium-sized deciduous perennial grass which forms a dense green fountain of hair-like leaves ending in silvery feathery flowers which sway gracefully in the slightest breeze. It blooms continuously from late spring until the first hard frost. It grows best in poor soil and sun.

**Syringa baidust 'Fairy Dust Lilac'**

This deciduous small tree is a delightful dwarf lilac grown for its masses of dainty pale pink fragrant blossoms usually produced twice each year, once in late spring and again in late summer. An ideal border plant for the smaller garden.

**Syringa meyeri 'Palibin'**

Medium-sized bushy deciduous shrub, grown for its profuse heads of small very fragrant tubular lilac-pink flowers in late spring or early summer. Ideal for a shrub border in a sunny site.

**Syringa pubescens subsp. microphylla 'Miss Kim'**

Medium to large deciduous bushy shrub with small green leaves, grown for its lovely very fragrant cerise-pink flowers. A nice lilac for small gardens to give a cottage garden effect. Leaves may turn purple in autumn.

**Syringa vulgaris 'Sensation'**

Large upright deciduous shrub or small tree, grown for its dense clusters of beautiful sweetly scented purple-pink flowers with white edges borne in profusion in late spring and summer. Very attractive to butterflies. Prefers a sunny site.

**Tamarix tetrandra (Tamarisk)**

Large deciduous shrub or small tree with attractive feathery foliage which bears plume-like cascades of pink flowers in mid and late spring. Useful for a shrub border. May also be used as a windbreak or hedge in exposed coastal areas, and for light sandy soils.

**Taxus baccata (Common or English Yew)**

Large evergreen conifer with dark green needle-like leaves which makes an excellent hedge and can be pruned to shape or used for topiary. Highly toxic if ingested.

**Taxus baccata 'Fastigiata Robusta' (f) (Irish yew)**

Large conical evergreen coniferous tree, forming a dense compact column with black-green leaves. A very popular yew, often grown in churchyards. Grow as a specimen or for topiary. All parts highly toxic if ingested.

**Teucrium hircanicum 'Purple Tails'**

Small perennial with green mint-like leaves grown for its long deep rose-purple flower spikes borne throughout the summer, giving a cottage garden effect to your garden. Needs a well-drained sunny site, ideal for a border. Attractive to bees and butterflies.

**Teucrium x lucidrys (Wall Germander)**

Small evergreen bushy aromatic shrub with small dark green leaves. It is covered with a profusion of rose-pink flowers from July to September. Attractive to bees and butterflies. Grows well in a sunny border. Ideal cottage garden plant.

**Thalictrum aquilegiifolium (Meadow rue)**

Small to medium clump-forming perennial, grown for its blue green aquilegia-like foliage and its profusion of delicate fluffy clouds of soft pink to deep lilac flowerheads borne in clusters on tall stems from early summer. Attractive to bees and butterflies. Ideal for a border or wild garden. All parts are poisonous if ingested.

**Thuja occidentalis 'Amber Glow'**

A very compact dwarf conifer, forming a ball of deep golden foliage in summer, and turning a rich amber in winter. Ideal for small gardens, containers, rockeries and borders. Contact with foliage may aggravate skin allergies.

**Tiarella 'Iron Butterfly' (Foam Flower)**

Small herbaceous perennial with striking attractively cut mid-green leaves with unusual dark veins. Throughout spring and summer it bears foamy clouds of small star-shaped fragrant white flowers. Ideal ground cover in a woodland garden or shady border.

**Tiarella 'Mint Chocolate'**

Small clump-forming perennial with striking attractively cut mint-green and chocolate coloured leaves. In spring and summer it bears foamy clouds of spikes of small cream flowers. Ideal ground cover in a woodland garden or shady border.

**Tiarella 'Pink Bouquet'**

Small herbaceous perennial grown for its attractive chocolate-stained maple-shaped leaves and foamy clouds of pink flowers throughout spring and summer. Easy to grow in any situation, ideal ground cover in a woodland garden or shady border.

**Trachelospermum jasminoides (Star Jasmine)**

Large evergreen woody-stemmed twining climber with large oval leaves and highly fragrant white jasmine-like flowers in mid to late summer, followed by pendent pod-like fruits containing tufted seeds. Rather slow-growing, shelter from cold dry winds.

**Trachycarpus fortunei (Chusan or Windmill Palm)**

Evergreen palm grown for its striking large fan-shaped green leaves which give that tropical feel to your garden. It bears sprays of small yellow flowers in summer. It is ideal for a specimen tree and small enough to be grown in a restricted area such as a courtyard.

**Tricyrtis 'Adbane'**

Small herbaceous perennial with shiny spotted leaves, grown for its striking and unusual large pink spotted flowers fading to blue, produced in late summer to early autumn. Prefers partial shade.

**Trollius chinensis 'Golden Queen' (Globeflower)**

Small to medium perennial grown for its beautiful bowl-shaped buttercup-yellow flowers in spring and summer. Prefers moist soils. Ideal for a border or meadow garden or beside a pond or stream.

**Tulbaghia violacea 'Silver Lace' (v)**

Small vigorous semi-evergreen clump-forming perennial, which bears lilac-purple or lilac-pink flowerheads in summer and autumn, above a mass of narrow variegated blue-grey leaves.

**Uncinia rubra (Hook Sedge)**

Small evergreen perennial grass, grown for its striking leaves which vary in colour from greenish-red to rich reddish-brown. Narrow spikes of dark brown to black flowers are produced in mid and late summer. Ideal for the front of a border or a gravel garden.

**Verbena 'Claret'**

Small vigorous perennial grown for the masses of claret-coloured flowers borne profusely throughout the summer. Ideal ground cover plant, or for baskets and containers.

**Verbena 'Homestead Purple'**

Small vigorous ground-covering perennial grown for its masses of dark purple flowers borne profusely throughout the summer, contrasting with its dark green foliage. Ideal for containers or for edging a herbaceous border.

**Verbena bonariensis**

Medium-sized vigorous upright perennial, grown for its beautiful clusters of violet flowers borne on tall stems over a very long period from summer until late autumn. Prefers a sunny sheltered site. Ideal for the back of a border for that cottage garden effect. Cut back hard in spring, self-seeds freely.

**Veronica gentianoides (Speedwell)**

Small mat-forming perennial with dark green leaves, grown for its attractive spikes of cup-shaped pale blue, white and lilac flowers borne in late spring and early summer. Prefers a dry sunny site. Ideal for a herbaceous border or a rock garden.

**Veronica gentianoides 'Tissington White' (Speedwell)**

Low-growing mat-forming perennial grown for its attractive upright spikes of white flowers borne in May and June. Prefers a dry site. Ideal for the front of a border for that cottage garden effect.

**Veronica spicata 'Red Fox' (syn. Rotfuchs)**

Small to medium perennial grown for its profusion of pretty deep pink/red flower spikes borne above mounds of glossy, mid-green lance-shaped leaves, in early to late summer. Ideal for borders, banks, gravel gardens and containers, in a sunny well-drained position, to add a cottage garden feel.

**Viburnum x bodnantense 'Dawn'**

Medium-sized deciduous upright shrub with dark green leaves which are bronze when young. Glorious clusters of highly scented rose-tinted pink flowers are freely produced on bare stems from late autumn to early spring. An ideal plant to brighten the winter garden.

**Viburnum x burkwoodii**

Medium-sized evergreen bushy shrub with shiny dark green leaves. Attractive clusters of very fragrant white flowers open from pink buds in mid and late spring, followed by red fruits. Ideal for a shrub border or woodland garden.

**Viburnum davidii**

Low-growing evergreen spreading dome-shaped shrub with very large dark green leaves. Heads of tiny white flowers are produced in late spring, followed, if both male and female plants are present, by turquoise-blue egg-shaped fruits on female plants. Ideal for a shrub border or woodland garden.

**Viburnum opulus 'Aureum'**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub with bright yellow leaves which turn green with age. Lacecap-like heads of white flowers are borne in late spring and early summer followed by bright red fruits. Ideal to provide colour in a shrub border or woodland garden. Prefers partial shade as leaves can burn in full sun.

**Viburnum opulus 'Roseum' (Sterile) (Snowball Tree)**

Large deciduous shrub with green leaves which become purple-tinted in autumn. It is grown for its profusion of white pom-pom like flowers, sometimes turning pink, which are produced in late spring and early summer. As the common name suggests it looks like it is covered in snowballs. Makes a stunning addition to the border or woodland garden.

**Viburnum plicatum f. tomentosum 'Mariesii' (Japanese Snowball Bush)**

Medium-sized showy deciduous shrub with tiered branches bearing dark green leaves which turn purple-red in autumn. Grown for its large rounded white lacecap flowerheads that cover the branches in late spring and early summer, giving a delightful wedding cake-like effect. A stunning addition to the shrub border or woodland garden.

**Viburnum tinus (Laurustinus)**

Very popular medium to large evergreen shrub with dense dark green leaves. Masses of flattened clusters of white flowers are borne continuously from late autumn to early spring followed by dark blue/black fruit. Excellent winter flowering shrub which can be used to make an attractive formal hedge.

**Viburnum tinus 'Eve Price'**

Very popular medium-sized evergreen shrub with dense dark green leaves. It produces masses of carmine buds which open into flattened clusters of pink-tinged white flowers which are borne continually from late autumn to early spring. Ideal winter-flowering shrub for a small garden.

**Vinca difformis 'Jenny Pym' (Periwinkle')**

Evergreen trailing shrub with large dark glossy green leaves, which contrast well with the display of small pinkish-mauve flowers with white edges borne in late winter and spring. Prefers a well-drained site in sun or shade. Ideal for ground cover in a shrub border, woodland garden or bank. May cause mild stomach upset if ingested.

**Vinca minor**

Spreading mat-forming evergreen shrub producing long trailing stems and dark green leaves, grown for its profusion of blue-violet, sometimes pale blue, reddish purple or white flowers borne over a long period from mid-spring to autumn. Ideal ground cover in a border, woodland garden or on a shady bank. May cause mild stomach upset if ingested.

**Vinca minor 'Atropurpurea' (Lesser periwinkle)**

Spreading mat-forming evergreen shrub with dark green leaves and lovely dark plum-purple flowers, borne from mid-spring to late autumn. Ideal for an attractive carpet of colour in a woodland garden, shrub border or shady bank. Cut back in early spring. May cause mild stomach upset if ingested.

**Vinca minor 'Azurea Flore Pleno'**

Spreading mat-forming evergreen shrub with long trailing stems and dark green leaves, grown for its profusion of delightful double sky-blue flowers produced from mid-spring to autumn. Useful for ground cover in a woodland garden, shrub border or shady bank. May cause mild stomach upset if ingested.

**Vinca minor 'Illumination' (v)**

Delightful low-growing evergreen shrub grown for its attractive bright golden and green leaves and mid-blue flowers borne over a long period from spring to autumn. Ideal for ground cover in a woodland garden, shady bank or shrub border.

**Vinca minor 'La Grave' (Bowles' variety) (Lesser Periwinkle)**

Evergreen spreading shrub grown for its dark green leaves and beautiful lavender-blue flowers borne from spring to autumn. An excellent cottage garden ground cover plant, even under trees, where it will make an extensive carpet. Ideal for a woodland garden, shrub border or bank.

**Vitis coignetiae**

Large deciduous climber grown for its enormous heart-shaped dark green leaves which turn a brilliant red in autumn. Small unpalatable blue-black grapes are produced in autumn. Ideal for trellises, pergolas, fences, walls or growing through trees. One of the largest leafed climbers to give a jungle feel to your garden.

**Vitis vinifera 'Purpurea' (Vine)**

Large deciduous climber grown for its spectacular foliage which changes from claret-red to deep wine-purple. It produces small blue-black grapes in autumn which are grown for their ornamental value as they are unpalatable. Ideal for pergolas, trellises, fences or walls.

**Weigela 'Bristol Ruby'**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub with mid-green leaves grown for its abundant tubular ruby-red flowers opening from very dark red buds in late spring and early summer. Prune after flowering. Ideal for a shrub border, hedge or woodland garden.

**Weigela 'Florida Variegata' (v)**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub with attractive mid-green leaves broadly edged with creamy yellow which retain their freshness throughout the season. In late spring and early summer it bears a profusion of tubular rose-pink flowers. Prune after flowering. Ideal for a shrub border.

**Weigela 'Snowflake'**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub with dark green leaves grown for its tubular pure white flowers in late spring and early summer. Prune after flowering. Ideal for a shrub border.

**Weigela florida 'Foliis Purpureis'**

Medium-sized deciduous shrub with lovely dark purple leaves contrasting beautifully with the pink funnel-shaped flowers. Prune after flowering. Ideal for a shrub border, it is one of the best purple-foliaged plants for general planting.

**Wisteria floribunda 'Multijuga' (Japanese wisteria)**

Large deciduous twining climber with attractive foliage, grown for its long hanging clusters of lilac-blue pea-like fragrant flowers, which open gradually from the bases to the tips in early summer. The flowers are often followed by bean-like velvety pods. Ideal for walls, archways, pergolas or growing against buildings and trees. Prune after flowering and again in late winter.

**Wisteria sinensis (seedling) (Chinese Wisteria)**

Large deciduous twining climber grown for its beautiful hanging trails of long lilac blue flowers in early summer. Requires full sun for flowering but may not flower for several years. Ideal for south-facing walls, archways, pergolas, or growing against buildings and trees.

**Woodwardia fimbriata (Giant Chain Fern)**

Large semi-evergreen fern grown for its impressive erect bright green fronds. Prefers moist soil in a sheltered site in semi to full shade.

**Yucca filamentosa (Adam's Needle)**

Medium-sized evergreen shrub with long, dark green, sword-shaped leaves and tall spikes bearing heads of nodding, bell-shaped white flowers in mid and late summer. Makes a stunning architectural plant. Prefers a sunny site.

**Zantedeschia aethiopica**

Spectacular perennial which is evergreen in mild areas and has long arrow-shaped glossy bright green leaves. It is grown for the very large pure white flower structures (spathes) with yellow centres (spadices) which are borne from spring to midsummer. Can be grown as a pondside plant as it thrives in moist soils. Harmful if eaten. Skin and eye irritant.

**Zantedeschia aethiopica 'Crowborough' (Arum Lily)**

Spectacular medium-sized perennial, which is evergreen in mild areas and has large arrow-shaped glossy bright green leaves. Grown for its large trumpet-shaped white flowers from spring to mid-summer. Widely used by florists. Adds an exotic tropical feel to the garden. Prefers a moist site and a thick winter mulch to protect the crown. May cause a mild stomach upset if ingested, contact with sap may irritate the skin.

## WHOLESALE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE

### 1 GENERAL

These terms and conditions apply in preference to and supersede any terms and conditions referred to, offered or relied on by the Wholesale Customer, whether in negotiation or at any stage in the dealings between SWOP and the Wholesale customer, with reference to the goods to which the contract relates. Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, SWOP will not be bound by any standard or printed terms furnished by the Wholesale Customer in any of its documents.

### 2 DESCRIPTION

The description of the goods has been given by way of identification only and the use of such description shall not constitute a sale by description.

### 3 SAMPLE

Notwithstanding that a sample of the goods has been exhibited to and inspected by the Wholesale Customer, it is declared that such sample was exhibited and inspected solely to enable the buyer to judge for himself the quality of the plant specified and not so as to constitute a sale by sample.

### 4 POTTING

Most plants are grown in 2 litre pots and supplied with an indelible printed pot label.

### 5 AVAILABILITY

All plants listed are offered subject to availability on receipt of order.

### 6 LIABILITY

- A) No liability whatsoever shall be incurred by SWOP in respect of any representation made by SWOP to the Wholesale Customer or his agents before the contract was made, where such representation related or referred in any way to (i) the correspondence of the goods to any description or (ii) the quality of the goods or (iii) the fitness of the goods for any purpose whatsoever.
- B) All implied terms, conditions or warranties, statutory, common law or otherwise as to (i) the correspondence of the goods to any description or (ii) the statutory quality of the goods or (iii) the fitness of the goods for any purpose whatsoever (whether made known to SWOP or not), are hereby excluded from the contract.

### 7 PAYMENT

- A) Payment for goods supplied under the contract is due as cash on delivery/collection or in 30 days after delivery/collection where the Wholesale Customer has signed a credit agreement.
- B) If payment of the price or any part of it is not made by the due date, SWOP shall be entitled:
  - (i) to charge interest on the outstanding amount at the rate of 4% per annum above the Barclays Bank Base Rate accruing daily
  - (ii) to require payment in advance of delivery of undelivered goods
  - (iii) to refuse to make delivery of any undelivered goods whether ordered under the contract or not and without incurring any liability whatever to the Wholesale Customer for non-delivery or delay in delivery
  - (iv) to terminate the contract



- 8 RISK  
The risk in the goods will pass to the Wholesale Customer at the time of dispatch from SWOP's premises so that they will be at the Wholesale Customer's risk during transit and thereafter.
- 9 TIME  
SWOP undertakes to use its best endeavours to dispatch the goods on the promised delivery date, but does not guarantee to do so. Time of delivery shall not be the essence of the contract.
- 10 PROPERTY  
The property in the goods will not pass to the Wholesale Customer until payment of the price has been made in full.
- 11 DELIVERY  
Handling and/or delivery charges are not included in the price, and will be charged at cost where applicable.
- 12 VARIATION  
These terms and conditions may only be varied with the prior written agreement of SWOP.
- 13 PRICES  
Prices are subject to change without prior notice and are subject to VAT at the prevailing rate.
