


STAFF NEWS ...

Did you know that our Volunteers get a Cherry Tree birthday card on their birthday? One of our volunteers is an expert at creating an individual card with their name and relevant pictures. Everyone signs the card and it is another volunteer's job to take the cards round the nursery and get as many signatures as possible. On special birthdays, with a zero, we arrange for a cake to be made by Crumbs a local charity that we work with closely. These cakes are also themed as much as possible, so we've had a dart board, a Tardis, some Doctor Martin boots and a swimming pool to name a few.



Bournemouth Borough Council wished to dedicate a tree in memory of Jess Davies, our former manager. Their Arboricultural Team sent us a list of trees that we could choose from and we opted for the Black Walnut Juglans nigra. This is a statuesque and majestic tree when fully grown with distinctive dark, heavily ridged bark. It produces edible walnuts and we loved the idea of being able to share the delicious produce in the future. The tree is sited at Muscliff Arboretum, adjacent to Muscliff Lane and a short walk from the river bank. We held a private ceremony on the 27th November where we walked from Cherry Tree Nursery to the Arboretum along the banks of the River Stour. It is about one mile and a beautiful walk. We hoped to see

the otters but I expect we made too much noise as we walked along. At the tree we each took turns to place some soil around the sapling and then we read some poems. We look forward to watching this small sapling grow, rather like Cherry Tree Nursery did and we can visit as the seasons change.

It's been a busy year at Chestnut Nursery, and it's only now that we look back and review the year we realise quite how busy it's been! Here's a brief roundup of what's been happening at Chestnut Nursery in 2017. Volunteers have enjoyed trips to the RNLI training facility, Compton Acres and Marwell Zoo as well as the events we hold at the nursery such as our fish and chip day in March and summer BBQ in August where we were joined by 3 helpers from Lloyds Bank who helped to prepare and cook the food.

Our volunteers have also enjoyed lots of lovely homecooked meals this year thanks to food donations from Tesco and Sainsburys. The lunches have become a regular event and an opportunity not only for

volunteers to enjoy lunch together but also to learn new skills by helping with the cooking.

This year we were very lucky to welcome groups of helpers from Morgan Sindall in May and BNY Mellon in October to spend a day with us and help with jobs on the nursery. It means a lot to us to have the support from companies like these and we were able to get lots of jobs done that we wouldn't be able to otherwise, like painting the black railings at the front of the nursery, giving our meeting room a fresh coat of paint.



Trethowans Solicitors have been a wonderful support to Chestnut this year, running a very popular stall at the open day, printing the design for this years Christmas card and most exciting of all- they are fundraising to provide us with a new kitchen!

Dolphin Shopping Centre chose Chestnut as one of 3 charities to support this year and have kindly given us the opportunity to have a stall in the centre for 4 dates to sell our stock and promote the charity. They will also be donating the proceeds of the sale of their delicious 'Rooftop Honey' and from ticket sales from this year's Christmas Grotto.

A big thank you must go to the Lions of Poole who raised funds to buy us a new van. The Lions have been raising funds for us since 2001 and are celebrating their 100th year!

Our sale days have gone from strength to strength with higher numbers of customers attending and more plants sold than ever before. We hope to build on this next year at our sale day on Saturday 17th March and our open day on 9th June.





We are really excited to say that we are not far from our target and have a provisional build start date of 2nd July 2018! As regular customers are aware, we have been busy fund raising for a new shop and poly tunnels to improve the working conditions for our volunteers and to enable us to stock a wider variety of items for your gardens. Thanks to our lovely customers, we have raised over £3000 through our 'Buy a Brick Appeal'.

The new shop will offer a much nicer environment for everyone as well as providing more training opportunities for the volunteers to learn about stock management and customer service. There will be space to run more community type events and activities such as talks and workshops. The total cost of the project is £390.000, and to date we have raised £380.000. This has been received from some fantastic supporters including Trusts, Foundations, customers and the families of people who have benefited from our work.
